

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B) August 1, 2021

"Jesus said to them," 'I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst' John 6:35.

What's your *personal* response to Jesus, the Bread of Life?

Jesus spoke to a group of people--a group that served as a convenient "stand-in" for all of us who read the Gospel of John. Bread is an integral part of the Jewish meal and diet. The Jews were to eat unleavened bread during the Passover feast and then for seven more days to celebrate their exodus from Egypt. When the Jews were wandering in the desert for 40 years, God rained down "bread from heaven" to sustain their nation (Exodus 16:4).

In last week's Gospel (John 6:1-15) Jesus fed a crowd of over 5,000 people with a boy's five small barley loaves of bread and two fish. He also had lots of leftovers. After the miracle, Jesus and His disciples crossed back to the other side of Galilee. When the crowd saw that Jesus had departed, they followed Him. Jesus took the time to teach the people an important lesson. He accused the crowd of ignoring His miraculous signs. They had failed to get the message from the miracle; they did not even know that there **was a message** in it. All they knew was when they went hungry, Jesus had fed them abundantly. **Their thoughts rose no higher than their physical needs.**

The danger in miracles is they breed a craving for more miracles. "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in You?" "What can You do?" John 6:30. The people referenced back to a comparable miracle in the life of Moses, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat" (John 6:31). The important message was, Jesus wanted them to think beyond the material to the spiritual, beyond the temporal to the eternal. Jesus equated Himself with bread. Bread is essential (in many cultures) for physical life. Jesus is saying that He is essential (to the world) for eternal life. Jesus corrected their theological. "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven (John 6:32). Jesus declared that it was not Moses but God who performed that daily miracle for 40 years. Moses was an instrument in God's divine hand. Manna was perishable bread, fit only to sustain the physical being. "My Father," Jesus said, "gives you the true bread from heaven." The manna was heaven- sent bread; Jesus was heavensent true bread. Jesus declared that the ordinary bread of this earth is not enough. If we are to obtain eternal

life, then we need the **bread of heaven-which is** Jesus Himself.

A personal response is needed from you. The people asked Jesus, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" John 6:28. Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that vou believe in the one He sent" John 6:29. We must first believe that Jesus is the Son of God (John 20:31). Secondly, we must digest the Bread of Life. A banana is not going to give you potassium sitting in your hand. You have to digest it. An orange is not going to give you vitamin C while in your hand. You got to digest it. The Bread of Life has to be digested. The Word (which is Christ) has to be digested and practiced in our life. Not until an individual personally receives Christ, into their life, can Christ impart the life of God in them. "You are from God, little children, and have overcome them because greater is He that is in you-than he that is in the world" I John 4.4
