Are You Hungry, Tired and Weary, Jesus Invites You to The Eucharistic Table!

Have you ever found your life wearisome? Do you know someone who complains of being tired of living? Has anyone shared with you how heavy the burdens of his or her life are? Have you ever come to your wits' end, and the waves of life toss you up and down? Have you felt like you were drowning and didn't know what to do? Have you ever prayed: "enough! I've had it! Lord just let me lie down and die here and now!" If so, then you can sympathize with the Prophet Elijah. He was hungry, tired and deeply depressed, and he gave up on living. God came to his rescue. In the same manner Jesus invites you to come to God at the Eucharistic table and be fed.

Some eight hundred years before the birth of Christ, King Ahaz and his wife, Queen Jezebel ruled Israel. Queen Jezebel brought into the Temple of God her own Phoenician god called Baal and worshipped it there. The Prophet of God, Elijah, entered a bet with Ahaz and Queen Jezebel on Mount Carmel to determine who is the real God. Even though the King and the Queen lost the bet, Queen Jezebel resolved to kill Elijah for executing her prophets. She sent her army after him. Elijah became very frightened and quickly ran from Mount Carmel to Beersheba and continued one hundred miles away into the desert in southern Judea. There, hungry, tired and deeply depressed, he begged God to let him die and went to sleep under a solitary broom tree in the middle of the desert. He had had enough, and he gave up! But roused and fed by God, the Prophet walked for forty days and nights to meet God on Mount Horeb, also known as Mount Sanai. What began as an escape from a dangerous and untenable situation ended up being a journey to meet God who strengthened him to continue his ministry. The Elijah story tells us that when human resources fail, and all hope is gone, God's power provides the unexpected strength for the divine plan to continue. The journey of escape becomes a pilgrimage to meet God.

For the followers of Jesus who also experience what Elijah went through, and for those who murmur and

find it difficult to believe because they find life burdensome and cannot look beyond the signs of bread and wine, Jesus invites you to come to the Eucharist. "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28–30).

Elijah's story tells us that God listens to the prayers of His beloved children and answers them. Challenging and depressing though his situation was, the Prophet did not do anything to end his own life. He asked God to "take my life, for I am no better than my fathers", and God answered his prayers. Before meeting God, the Prophet had to deal with the gap between his mighty accomplishments and the doubts about his own future as well as that of his peoples.

Just as the Prophet Elijah was nourished and rejuvenated as he rested under the broom trees in the desert, so will those who rest in Jesus and partake of His Eucharistic meal gain the strength to continue living their lives to the full. Rest, as Jesus says, is not just taking a break or time out. It is being rejuvenated and energized to continue living for Christ.

Jesus, the bread of life, invites us to come to him and be fed so that we too can continue laboring in his vineyard. This bread from heaven not only provides the energy to minister but also gives life more abundantly than any could imagine. Refusal to accept Jesus as the true bread from heaven demonstrates our lack of faith in our own values and in God.

As we "do this in remembrance of Me" (1Cor 11:26), we make present how God sustains the Prophet and his people, the poor and needy. The stories of Elijah and Jesus, the Bread of Life, give us the clue to help us recognize God's action in our lives. These and many such stories in the Scriptures help answer the question of whether or not Jesus is God, and that through him we have life to the full. May our hearts always long for God through Jesus, the Bread of Life.






