“Let us go on to the neighboring towns. So that I may proclaim the message there also: for that is what I came out to do.”
 Mark 1:38-39

In ten days Lent will begin and we will be reminded of Jesus’ sufferings, from forty days in the desert to his passion and death, but today we hear Job lamenting the tragedies that have come to define his life. His sufferings are, to him, incomprehensible. He has lost all hope. None of us suffer as greatly as Job, but we have reason to hope. The psalmist reassures us that the Lord heals the wounded and brokenhearted. Paul willingly embraces his difficulties for the gospel. Jesus places the healing of the sick and troubled at the heart of his ministry. As we listen to today’s readings, let us look for hope in the Lord.

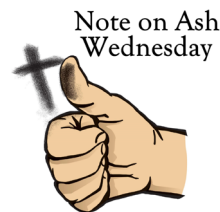
Stewardship Reflection

Note on Ash Wednesday

This year ashes will not be imposed on the forehead in the manner to which we are accustomed. On January 12, 2021, the Holy See published a directive (cf. Prot.N. 17/21) that on Ash Wednesday the celebrant will impose ashes by sprinkling. The celebrant blesses the ashes and then he addresses all those present saying *“Repent, and believe in the Gospel”* or *“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return”*. He then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him. He takes the ashes and sprinkles a pinch of ashes on the crown of each person’s head without saying anything. This directive applies to Ash Wednesday in 2021 only.

"So I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me" Job 7:3

Job shows us how to deal with loss

Job teaches us what to do when we suffer loss. He lost his ten children (Job 1:18-19), his health (Job 2:7), and his livelihood. His helpmate (wife) even lost confidence in him (Job 2:9). In his grief, he said, *"I shall not see happiness again"* Job 7:7. Job lost everything, **but his faith**. In his lowest moment, he still, *"fell down upon the ground, and worshipped"* (Job 1:20). How could he worship God, when he had been stripped of everything?

Hurricane Harvey was a monster Category 4 hurricane that made landfall on Texas and eventually Louisiana in **August of 2017**. It caused catastrophic flooding and many deaths. In four days, many areas of Houston received more than 40 inches of rain as Harvey slowly meandered over southeast Texas. The floodwaters inundated hundreds of thousands of homes and displaced more than 30,000 people and prompted more than 17,000 rescues. Several parishioners at St. Francis Xavier were directly affected by Hurricane Harvey.

Many months after Harvey left Houston, I received a text message from a parishioner asking me to come by and bless her remodeled home. I told her that I would be honored. When I stepped into their home, I could not see any signs of the flooding that Harvey had caused—it was gorgeous inside and out. She said that their home had never been flooded, but late in the night when the hurricane hit, water started coming under the front door. Water rescuers never came so her family and many of the neighbors walked through waist-deep water to reach high ground. I asked her, what advice would you give to others who haven't experienced a flooded home. She immediately responded in two words **Flood Insurance!** If you live in Houston, get flood insurance. She explained that the Home owner's insurance **didn't cover damage caused by rising water**; only flood insurance did that. After determining that the extensive damage done to her home was caused by rising water, the insurance adjuster asked, "do you have flood insurance?"

She found the flood insurance policy and showed it to the adjuster. Having flood insurance was the game-changer, she said. "My husband and I had to move out of our house for months, but now we are back." She said, "many of our neighbors are still recovering and some may never recover because they didn't have flood insurance." **The flood insurance didn't stop the hurricane**, but it helped tremendously with recovery from the storm.

In the same way, Job kept the faith during his loss. In Job 1:1- Job's faith is mentioned, *"he feared God and he shunned evil."* You may have lost a spouse, some siblings, some friends, but hold on to your faith, because your faith in God will help you get through your loss.



St. Paul said, *"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."* 2 Timothy 4:12.

Having faith in God did not keep Job from great loss and calamity, but in the end *"the Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning..."* John 42:12.

Because of the testimony of that parishioner, I eventually got flood insurance for my home. I hope and pray that because of the witness of Job you will continue to keep your faith in God—regardless of your loss. <> Deacon Jenkins

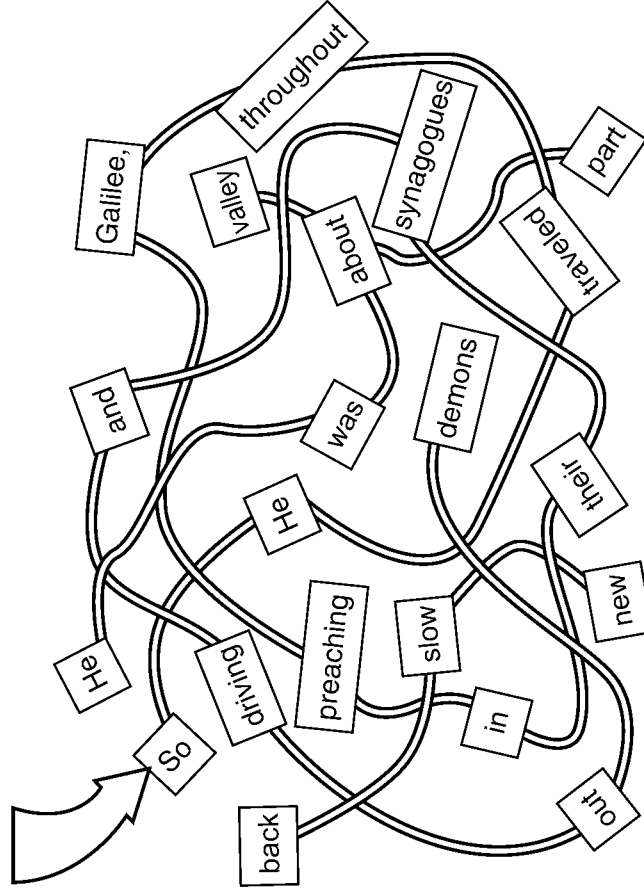
