



Happy Sunday!! Today is the First Sunday of Lent. How are we doing

Have you kept your commitment so far on what you decided to do for Lent? Or are you still undecided on what you are going to do? Here is the real question, will the sacrifice or change we are willing to make bring us closer to Jesus? That's why we make the commitment. We model Jesus' sacrifice in the desert, in a very small way, to prepare our minds and our hearts for Easter. We do it to become closer to Jesus.

For example, if you've decided to cut back on watching TV, are you replacing that time by devoting more time to prayer? Or, if you've decided to do more of something, rather than to cut out something...that could bring you closer to Jesus. One could decide to go to Mass twice a week or read the Bible every day during Lent.

## Lent Prepares Us for Easter, Our **Life on Earth Prepares Us for** Heaven

Now, brothers and sisters, once we have committed to make a change to get closer to Jesus, guess who is ready to de-rail us from our plan. The devil. The minute we are moving in the direction toward God, the devil is ready to step-in and knock us off track.

Satan does NOT like our getting close to God and will do anything to de-rail our attempts at holiness. Satan wants us Christians...who are on track. He doesn't want the ones who are off track because he's already got them.

So...in today's Gospel reading, we see that the devil is trying to knock Jesus off track.

# Lent Prepares Us for Easter, Our Life on Earth **Prepares Us for Heaven**

The liturgical readings for Lent always commence with the story of the temptation. Jesus goes out into the desert to be tempted by the devil. Again, the devil always has one purpose in the bible and that is to move us off the path that leads to God...and...to order your desire in the direction of something other than God. So that, the primary desire of your life, is something other than our Creator.

So, the devil confronts Jesus and tempts him. Now Jesus had been in the desert 40 days and 40 nights fasting and praying. He is alone, he is isolated. He is exhausted. I imagine, in his humanness, that he is weak

This is the time that Satan chooses to strike. He wants to tempt and de-rail Jesus when he is hungry, isolated, and tired. So he tells Jesus, in Luke, turn these stones into bread. In other words, the devil is telling Jesus to make the desires of the flesh the priority over God.

Read symbolically...make sensual pleasure the center of your life. Make the satisfaction of your bodily desires...for food, and for intimacy, and for drink and for pleasure, the center of your life.

Now...we like the pleasures of the body. We think they are good, they are God given. But, when they become dominant, when they become the Lord of your life, then your deepest desire for God isn't realized.

And so Jesus says, to the devil, one will not live by bread alone. But by every word that comes from the mouth of God. In other words, Jesus says, I refuse to use my power for my own benefit and accept whatever God wills.

The devil goes on to tempt Jesus 2 more times while he is in the desert. He proposes to Jesus that he throw

himself down off the parapet of the temple. In this 2<sup>nd</sup> test, the devil threw out scripture on Jesus. So...be careful, brothers and sisters, the devil knows scriptures too. He quoted Psalm 91:11 when he tells Jesus, "For it is written: He will command his angels concerning you and with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." The devil quotes scripture because he wants Jesus to put God to the test. The devil then tempts Jesus by offering him power. If Jesus would worship Satan, then Satan would give him all the kingdoms of the

world. Jesus doesn't bend, he doesn't yield

to the temptation of power. Power is very tough temptation for us. We want power at our jobs, we want power over our spouses, we want power over our children, and young people want power over their parents. What values are we willing to let go of for power? How can you resist the temptation of power? You may remember, 14 years ago, in 2007, Tony Dungy became the first black head coach to win the Super Bowl when his Indianapolis Colts defeated the Chicago Bears. The reason I tell you this...is that

Tony Dungy is a Christian. He was unlike other NFL head coaches. He didn't let the power of his position be the priority in his life. He kept God first above his job and his power.

I imagine that the devil was in his ear at every turn to tempt him to put his power and position above God. But Tony Dungy kept faith and family above football. He said "I know I probably didn't get a couple of jobs in my career because people could not see my personality or the way I was going to do it. For your faith to be more important than your job, for your family to be more important than that job."

Brothers and sisters, temptation

Brothers and sisters, temptation is a very real part of life and is especially challenging in our wilderness times. When we are down, discouraged, afraid, disappointed and lonely. Satan loves to kick us when we are down.

And if you are Christian, you are going to get hit.

I loved Deacon Jenkins' homily one Sunday when he put on his Texans football jersey. He said, when you go into the football game, you are going to get hit. You have to be prepared to get back up and get into the game.

The Deacon's point was, when we put on our uniforms, as Christians, when we go out of these doors, when we get into the game, we are going to get hit.

We are going to have the storms of life that hit us. We are going to have temptation to hit us.

Brothers and sisters, every temptation we encounter...brings us with it...a corresponding challenge. Meeting those challenges head on, as Jesus did, is how we rise above the temptations.

When we find ourselves in the wilderness, it gives us an opportunity to turn toward God and not away from God.

# Lent Prepares Us for Easter, Our Life on Earth Prepares Us for Heaven

The Good News is...being tempted is an opportunity for victory. It's an opportunity for victory with our Lord.

You see temptation and sin are different. Temptation is an opportunity to sin, but it's not, in and of itself...sin. So we have victory when we rise up to meet the challenges head on and persevere:

- > in doing what's right,
- > in being faithful to God,
- > in trusting God,
- in listening to God, and
- in loving others as God loves us.

The Good News here is that God strengthens us to meet all of these challenges.

Jesus is with us when we are in the wilderness. And he knows what it's like to be tempted. He knows what it's like to get hit.

He was hungry and isolated and tired.

Sometimes we get hungry and isolated and tired.

- ➤ When our power and water are off and we are cold.
- ➤ There will be times when our physical energy levels are low
- > Times when we've been working too much
- > Times when we are stressed
- ➤ Times when we are sick or have an illness
- Times when our body life energy is depleted

We may feel like giving up...like tapping out. We may feel like giving in to the temptation. We are tired of the hits.

This is when, Brothers and Sisters, we must turn toward Jesus. St Paul wrote about this experience to the Church in Corinth, in 2 Corinthians, we he says, "We are afflicted in every way, but not constrained; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body."

In Jesus, we share in his suffering in the wilderness and in his glory in his resurrection. He is with us. He won't let us down. Jesus loves us. Today, we Christians, are Jesus' hands and feet in the world. We are his disciples. We are his light. Brothers and sisters, some of you may be thinking, Deacon Darryl, but I'm not in a wilderness right now. Things are going fine. I am on the mountaintop. My marriage is great, my relationship with my kids and my family is great, my health is


great, I don't have the coronavirus, and my business or job is doing well. I am not hungry or isolated or tired right now.

Well...we still have some of our brothers and sisters...around us...in the wilderness. Even though things are great for you, God could be calling you to be Jesus' hands and feet for someone else in need. We can respond and we can help to ease the suffering of someone else. We can let Christ himself act through us to ease the loneliness, care for people in need, and comfort those who are anxious or heartbroken or ill.

People in need...need our love and our presence. They need our prayers. They need us to be proclaimers of hope and the Gospel, which is the Good News. In closing, wherever we are today...whether we are in the wilderness or on the mountaintop or somewhere in between, let us know that, Jesus is with us. Let us always stay turned toward him. Through his grace, our hearts and minds can be transformed.

Let us continue this week to prepare our hearts and minds, during Lent, for the coming of Easter. We can prepare by meeting God daily in prayer. We can prepare by studying scripture and in worship.

We have an opportunity this week to worship Jesus during our St Francis Xavier Lenten revival. I hope you all can come out or attend via live stream. We can, together, raise Him up in glory and get closer to Him in our praise and worship.
