



Are Your Christmas Decorations Still Up?

The Church's liturgical season of Christmas ends in the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite with the movable feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls in early to mid-January. After revisions to the missal in 1962. the calendar of the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite marks the end of Christmas on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, fixed to Jan. 13. Previously, it had been long standing tradition to mark the end of Christmastime on Feb 2 — the feast of the Lord's Presentation in the Temple, which is literally 40 days after Christmas, as indicated in Scripture.

With Baptism We are Charged to Continue the Mission of Jesus Christ

With the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the Christmas season has come to an end. Tomorrow we begin the period called ordinary time. We use green as our liturgical color. The Christmas paraphernalia and decorations come down and are stored for another year. Baptism marks the beginning of the believer's life. It is an auspicious sacramental initiation which begins the believer's mission. For the believer to mature and bear good fruits, it behooves the baptized to follow through the mission to the end. This means living a graced life rooted in a relationship with the one in whom you are baptized and who inspires and influences all other relationships and life experiences.

In the Biblical times, many people, including kings, prophets and holy people were called to serve God. However, it is only in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah that God spoke of someone with whom he was especially pleased. Even there, the identity of the people or person(s) were not revealed. Those statements were made 500 years before Christ was born and were made in poetic forms. They are referred to in Isaiah's writings as songs, but they perfectly describe Jesus. In Mark's recording of Jesus' baptism, the voice of God is heard introducing him to the whole world, not only as God's Son, but as His **beloved** Son.

Last week the Magi helped us realize that this **beloved** Son, Jesus is also the King of the universe. This week God again reveals Jesus at his baptism by John, not just as the **beloved** son but also the King of the Universe "with whom I am well pleased".

Baptism is also an initiation rite that makes a person become a full member of a group with all its rights and privileges. It, therefore, impels the baptized person to follow the mission of the organization through from the moment of baptism to the end. The bible talks about different forms of baptisms e.g., the baptism of the Pharisees, John the Baptist, and Jesus, etc. Since John's baptism was that of repentance which calls for preparation for the coming of the Lord, it was puzzling to him, John, why Jesus wanted his Baptism of repentance.

We can understand who the magi were and their role as representing the gentiles in the presence of the newborn King of the Jews, as Pilate called Jesus. The challenge is why the sinless King of the Universe had to subject himself to John's baptism of repentance. Several explanations have been given and I submit the one given by Fr. Joe Robinson in the Cycle B Issue of the Guiding Light.

Fr. Robinson gives four reasons why Jesus got the "Johnnie baptism". First, some church fathers have suggested that Jesus went into the Jordan river, not to be made holy, but to make the water holy so that all waters of the world would become life giving through the sacrament of baptism. For others, Jesus' baptism shows us what baptism will do, that is, it brings the Spirit down on the baptized to become the **beloved** children of God. Many also believe that the baptism of Jesus was the official inauguration of the work of his father. With his baptism, Jesus was ready to proclaim the gospel, the good news, and invite people to turn their hearts to God. God the Father and the Holy Spirit put their approval seal on him and promised to guide him in this ministry to the world. Jesus baptism is, therefore, an example for us who dare to be baptized and become God's children. This is inferred from Mathew 28:16-20 where Jesus commanded his followers to "go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you."

So, whether we were baptized when we were infants or adults, baptism gives us the nourishment and the opportunity to grow spiritually. It gives the direction for God's life in us.

John acknowledged that the nature of his baptism was to prepare hearts for the coming of God's Kingdom and so was a visible means to seal conversion. For Jesus, baptism is a total allegiance to God's kingdom. The mission of Jesus juxtaposed that of John is not simply for conversion of heart, but to establish a relationship for his followers to believe that they are loved by God.

The celebration of the baptism of the Lord, therefore, reminds us of our own baptism and re-affirms our total allegiance to serve in the mission of Jesus Christ. Through baptism we have been given the nourishment and the opportunity to grow spiritually. We are charged then with the command to "go and make disciples" and initiate them into the Triune God.




