



You Too, Are Called!

The Scriptures offer a more substantive method of recognizing and responding to our vocations (calls from God). Each call is presented in the form of a dialogue to help discern the overture of God. It starts with a process of wondering, puzzling and then waiting to do the will of God.

I grew up as a mission boy. I was among many young boys who hung around the Church. We helped the priest when he came to visit our village church and served him at the altar. We cleaned the Church and rectory (mission) as well as anything that needed to be done around the Church. This included towing the Church bells at 6:00 am, noon and 6:00 pm. For us, there was nothing extraordinary about our work, we did it because we wanted to do it. However, the priest, seeing our vocations, kept asking us individually if we would like to be priests or enter religious lives. Many of us responded in the affirmative. Some left the Minor Seminary and the other religious institutions. Some stayed and persevered to become priests and religious, and some left the Seminary but later came back to the priesthood.

Today we hear of the calling of four people in the Bible. They all came at different times and in different ways. We are told in the Scriptures that about 1000 BC, there was a woman called Hannah who suffered a lot because she was unable to have children. She suffered bitterly, especially over her inability to have a son. She made a promise to God that if she were to have a son, she would dedicate him to God.

A son, Samuel, was born to her and after weaning the boy, she brought him to the Priest, Eli, who attended the Arc of the Covenant in Shiloh. There Samuel was raised and educated for the service of God. He served in the Temple under Eli's care. It was here in the Temple that Samuel's sleep was disturbed three times in one night. The third time it happened, Eli realized that God was calling Samuel and advised him to respond affirmatively to the calling. This is where Samuel's calling began. Listening became his way of life. He got a call that changed his life in the middle of the night. Under the direction of Eli, Samuel was able to change the lives of all God's people for over one hundred years. He established the Israel monarchy and anointed the first two kings.

John the Baptist, fulfilling the role as a forerunner to Jesus, fulfilled his prophetic mission by pointing others toward Jesus. Andrew and another disciple heard John talking about Jesus and they responded by leaving John to follow Jesus. The dialogue that ensued between them and Jesus ended with an invitation to "come and see". They came and stayed with Jesus, and shall we say, the rest is history!

Having experienced Jesus, Andrew could not help but to tell and invite his brother, Peter to share in his joy of finding the Messiah. Peter adhered to Andrew's invitation and his life also changed forever.

In Acts 9:1-9, we read how Paul's calling came in a more dramatic way. He was first thrown off his horse and a conversation ensued. In modern history, Martin Luther King received his call to the ministry of non-violent struggle for justice for all people in our nation in an unexpected way. He was a young pastor who was called to lead a movement that was struggling for the rights of the disadvantaged.

In reflecting on these and other vocations, it becomes clear that we all have a vocation but are all not called in the same manner. God's calling does not pertain only to priesthood or religious lives. It is rather a call to full realization in the mission of Christ. In all of these callings, be they to religious or marital life, or volunteering for some kind of service, they all require guidance.

As we come together for the Eucharistic meal, may we pray that God helps us know our individual vocation and give us the grace and strength to follow it.
