"Is He [Jesus] not the carpenter, the son of Mary...?" Mark 6:3

Faith precedes miracles

The Sunday's Gospel for last weekend (13th Sunday in Ordinary Time-Mark 5:21-43) preceded today's Gospel reading-Mark 6:1-6). In the Mark 5 passages we see a woman miraculous cured by merely touching Jesus' cloak. Jesus then restores a young girl to life. In today's Gospel reading "[Jesus] was not able to perform any mighty deed there" Mark 6:5. He was only able to heal "a few sick people by laying His hands on them" (Mk. 6:5). What was the major difference between the people who came to Jesus in last week's Gospel and the residents of His hometown of Nazareth? It was revealed in the final line of today's Gospel. "[He] Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith" Mark 6:6. The people in Mark 5 had faith in Jesus and the people in Mark 6 did not have faith in Jesus. Let's look at some lessons from the people who had faith in Jesus versus the people who did not have faith in Jesus

First, Jesus did not try to heal some of those people and found himself incapable of healing them. As one commentary indicated, **few people had faith enough to come to Jesus for healing.** I could see Jesus standing outside of the synagogue, where He just taught the people ready to perform a miracle in their life, but because they only saw Him as a **carpenter**, the Son of Mary, they never approached Him. **Only a few sick people believed** and approached Him. Jesus laid His hands on the few who came and they were healed (Mark 6:6).

"Faith without works is dead" (James 2:26). Faith can't be by itself. It has to be accompanied by **works**. In the Gospel reading last weekend, the woman who had been afflicted with hemorrhaging for 12 years, said to herself, "If I but touch His clothes, I shall be cured" Mark 5:28. Notice her works. She **touched** His garments, and "immediately her flow of blood dried up" Mark 5:29. When you act, you give life to your faith. Jairus, the synagogue official (also in last

weekend's Gospel) "*came forward*" to ask for healing for his little daughter. Then he,

"fell at [Jesus] feet and pleaded earnestly with Him." Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live" Mark 5:23. Jairus had actions, to go with his faith.

Earlier in Mark's Gospel, four men brought their paralyzed friend to Jesus. They tore a hole

in the roof of the house where Jesus was teaching. The text said Jesus **saw their faith** and healed the man sick of the palsy Mark 2:5. Jesus saw the

unbelief (not faith) in the people of Nazareth.

Jairus did not see Jesus as only a **carpenter**, but as **Healer**, who could make his daughter whole. Those who lived with Jesus in Nazareth thought they knew Him. He fixed their tables, chairs, and doors. They ate and drank with His extended family.



When Jesus stepped outside the role they had **boxed for Him**, they still regarded Him as just another workman. Jesus' countrymen failed to perceive God's presence and power in Him.

Faith precedes miracles. Jesus did not heal people so they would believe in Him.

Rather, Jesus healed those whose faith **drove** them to Him. Their **faith** (Hebrews. 11:1) in Jesus **gave assurance** (evidence) that He had the power to change their lives!
