The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

We are working with stakeholder groups to get their input on ways we can best provide this assistance, and to enlist their help with outreach to families and communities. FEMA will begin to implement COVID-19 funeral assistance in April.

Happy Palm Sunday! Today, brothers and sisters, is the last Sunday in Lent and the beginning of Holy Week. Palm Sunday, the Passion of our Lord. We have one more week in our Lenten journey. The readings today say it all. There is joy and pain. There is joy in the midst of suffering.

We began with the joy as Jesus enters Jerusalem and the people rejoice. The promised Savior has finally come! The Messiah is here! Redemption is at hand! But then, on the other hand, there is pain. There is pain in our Lord's rejection, suffering, and death. But the good news today is that He went through His pain and suffering for a purpose. For us, for you and me. Out of His love for us.

What seems to be Christ's defeat is actually His victory, the victory of everlasting love. I heard a preacher say one time, that it was Jesus' <u>un-success</u> that led to his success.

- For the love of us, Jesus gave His, "back to those who beat" Him. This is in our first reading today from Isaiah.
- ➤ For the love of us, Jesus did not shield His face "from buffets and spitting."
- For the love of us, Jesus obediently accepted "death, even death on a cross!"
- For the love of us, Jesus, "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness and found human in appearance, he humbled himself..."

And so, brothers and sisters, Jesus emptied himself. He <u>voluntarily</u>, for the love of us, emptied His power, emptied His status, and emptied His security. He was able to do this because He stayed in prayer and was guided by the Holy Spirit.

Remember when Jesus was in the wilderness? He was tempted to increase, not to empty Himself. He was tempted, by the devil, to chase the worldly priorities...to be powerful, to

be relevant, and to be spectacular. We, too, are challenged with these world values. Jesus' self-emptying was against the values of the world. Jesus moved downward instead of upward. He decreased so that we might increase. He didn't climb up the ladder to success but climbed down the ladder to greatness. And St Paul says, "Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name, which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess, that Jesus Christ is Lord." Jesus became great because He emptied himself taking the form of a slave.

Jesus Emptied Himself; He thought We Were Worth It

Jesus, in His passion in today's reading, gives us the example on how to live our Christian life. He follows God's will for Him above all else...even when His soul was sorrowful in the garden of Gethsemane and He was sweating blood because He could see His death. He humbled himself and was obedient. He was selfless in His love for us. He carried His cross. Can we become like Christ in this way and follow his example?

- ➤ Is it possible to follow Christ while fulfilling the demands of the world?
- ➤ To listen to Christ while our attention is being pulled by others?
- To carry Christ's cross while we carry many other burdens as well?
- ➤ To decrease so others can increase? It's a challenge, brothers and sisters. because we live in the world. Again, the world encourages upward mobility. It coaches us to climb up the ladder of success. And...there is not anything necessarily wrong with being successful or being ambitious. It's okay to want to move up. The problem is when moving up becomes the primary goal above and beyond the goal getting into heaven. It's a problem when the ambition for power overshadows the ambition to love and serve others. You try to step on somebody else instead of trying to love somebody else. It's the difference

between trying to raise ourselves up <u>over</u> trying to lift up our fellow human beings. It's about having our priorities right. It's about being humble, like Jesus, and serving others. Jesus said in Matthew, "Anyone who wants to be great among you must be your servant, just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve."

Jesus moved...

- > From power to powerless
- > From greatness to smallness
- > From success to failure
- > From strength to weakness
- > From glory to lowness

The whole life of Jesus was a life in which all upward mobility was resisted. Some people wanted to make Him king. They wanted Him to show power. They wanted to share in His influence and sit on thrones with Him. They wanted to sit on His left and on His right. But He consistently said no to all these desires and pointed the downward way.

"The Son of Man has to suffer..." He asks, "Can you drink the cup?" Brothers and sisters, in this last week of Lent, how can we model Christ's example today on the way to the cross? How can we respond to the selfless, sacrificial love that Christ has for us? We love him back. We praise him. We worship him. We pray. We give Him glory. We read His word which He revealed to us. We spread His Good News. We ask for God's grace and for the Holy Spirit to guide us in the way of the cross. We ask God to order our steps. The downward way is the way of the cross. Jesus says, "Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it."

I pray that we can all follow in the footsteps of Jesus. That we become Jesus' hands and feet in the world. That we can love like Jesus like Jesus loves. He died for our sins out of His love for us. He sacrificed his life for our eternal salvation.


