



Parishioners who attended the Vigil Mass on February 24th, witnessed a rare ceremony called 'Rite of Election'. After the Homily, Deacon Jenkins declared to Father Michael that two Catechumens, Tim Burris and Kelly Robles, were ready to participate in the Sacraments on Holy Saturday. Father Michael called the Catechumens and their sponsors up. He asked the sponsors 4 questions to make sure they were ready. Once he heard from the sponsors, he told the Catechumens to give their names for enrollment into the Book of the Elect by Deacon Jenkins. Father Michael then dated and signed the Book, signifying approval. Having their names in the Book of the Elect means they are committed to be faithful to the God who chose them!

Stewardship Reflection

That we may learn to turn away from the false idols of our society – those visible and invisible. "You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything..." - Exodus 20:4. THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT (Cycle B)

March 7, 2021 "[Jesus] made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area..." John 2:15

If Jesus came into *your temple*, what would He have to drive out, and would you even allow Jesus in your temple?

Lent is that period on the church's calendar where Christians prepare to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. We should strive to have a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

In today's gospel (John 2:13-25) Jesus arrives in Jerusalem to conclude His three and a half year ministry. The Scripture tells us that the "Passover is near" John 2:13.

Once in Jerusalem, Jesus went to His Father's house (the temple). In the temple area, Jesus "found those who sold oxen, sheep and doves as well as the money-changers" John 2:14. People would travel for miles to worship and celebrate the Passover and offer their sacrifices so they could atone for their sins. It would take some of them weeks to get to Jerusalem, so instead of traveling with live animals-they would purchase the animals when they arrived in Jerusalem and exchange money. The Jewish worshippers would also have to bring and pay a temple tax. Even today when you travel overseas--you must use the currency of that country to negotiate trade. The money exchangers would take the currency of a Jew from another country and exchange it for Jerusalem's currency.

When Jesus saw all of this occurring in the temple area, "He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves" John 2:15. Jesus also said, "take these out of here, and stop making My Father's house a marketplace" John 2:16.

In St. Paul's epistle to the church in Corinth, Paul

wrote, "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you" I Corinthians 6:19. Just like the temple in Jerusalem, our temple needs to be cleansed and swept out by Jesus.

How do you know what needs to be swept or driven out of your temple? Please read the first reading (Exodus 20)-which list the Ten Commandments. If you are breaking any of the commandments, then those violations need to be driven out of your temple.



Will you [even] allow Jesus into your temple? Years ago I was at a hotel in another city and when I returned that afternoon, housekeeping had not cleaned my room. When I notified housekeeping that my room was not cleaned, a lady in that department said, "you have a DO NOT DISTURB sign on your door, and we are not allowed to enter a room when we see that sign." Remove that sign, if you have it on the door of your temple, so Jesus can enter in and clean up.

Qualifications:

- Must live in area code 77033 or 77051
- Must have a valid state or federal identification and social security card
- Must have legal U.S. citizenship or resident status (or kids are citizens & parents are on the birth certificate)
- Must be below 80% average median income for Harris County
- Must have proof of income: 30 days of paycheck stubs, workmen's compensation letter, all award letters (ex. SSI/SSDI, TANF, food stamps, pension vet benefits, child)
- Applicant must be head of household
- You must provide a valid Lease or mortgage statement
- You must demonstrate proof of need such as vacate notice with the client's name on it, a documented hardship or proof of exhausting income
- Your Landlord or Mortgage Company must be willing to work with Harris County & guarantee residency for the next 30 days




