




Did you know that Catholics can make an Act of Spiritual Communion?

The Most Holy Trinity: A Unity of Love

Today we celebrate the mystery of who God is. The identity of God is a mystery no one can fully understand because God is too great for our human mind to fully comprehend. However, we cannot casually ignore God's identity since it is one of the fundamental truths of our faith. We use human language to explain who the Christian Church understand God to be. Scriptures has led the Church to confess the belief that God is one and that by this one God is three persons at the same time, namely the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We can understand Jesus as the Son of God, who lived with us. Jesus talked about God as His Father. However, it is extremely challenging to accept the Holy Spirit on equal terms with God, the Father and Jesus, God the Son.

Many years ago, I learned to define the Trinity as: God, the Father so loved himself that that love became an image of himself. This self-love is God the Son who took on the human image to dwell among us (in the person of Jesus Christ). The Love that exists between the Father and Son is so intense that it took on its own self-personification, God the Holy Spirit. I do not remember how I got this definition, and I cannot explain how this could come to be. But I believe it.

The one consolation I have appreciated in the Trinity is that God is greater than all of his creations. That explains why the knowledge of God is a mystery. Yet God still wants his creatures to know him. He, therefore, continues to reveal himself to us in various ways.

The existence of many Gods has always been part of the human-divine narrative. According to Scriptures it was Abraham who limited the worship of many Gods to one (monotheism). For us Christians, the manifestation of God's identity to us in the Trinitarian Form started with Jesus, the second person of the blessed Trinity. Jesus was a holy man, a great teacher and powerful worker of miracles. He spoke about God as his biological father, he is the Son, and promised the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, to his followers and anyone who accepts his teaching after he was gone. He was brutally and disgracefully killed; But he rose after three days in the tomb. He was immediately revered as Lord and God by his followers. This action made the early Christians appeared to be polytheists (believers or worshippers of many Gods). This perception placed the early followers of Christ between a rock and a hard place. The Jews saw the early Christians as worshippers of many gods and so persecuted them. The Christians, on the other hand,

would not acknowledge the pagan gods and so were rejected by the pagans. The Christians even struggled to explain and verbalize their faith in the Triune God, namely: Jesus as God the Son, and the Father is God. They struggled to fit the Holy Spirit in somewhere. It took over three hundred (300) years before they could develop or come up with the language and concepts to clarify that Jesus is equal to the Father in every respect and yet distinct from one another. This relationship between Jesus and His Father is not scriptural based but an article of faith for which many a Christian blood has been shed.

The position of the Holy Spirit in the Trinity took a longer time to develop. Even Christians, to this day, do not all accept the position of the Holy Spirit in the theology of the Trinity. The Roman Catholic Church believes that the "Spirit proceeds from the Father **and** the Son", whereas the Orthodox Greek Church proclaim that the "Spirit proceeds from the Father **through** the Son". This difference in belief, according to some theologians, is one of the main stumbling blocks preventing the unification of the Eastern, the Orthodox Greek, the Western, and the Roman Catholic Churches.

The mystery of the relationship between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit also communicates that God is a family. A family so closely united that despite their individual personalities the three are united as one God. This is the unity that Christians aspire to attain. Jesus prayed for such unity with passion at the Last Supper (Jn. 17).

The love and kindness of the Triune God bring us to share in the sonship of Jesus Christ. This promise of unity was not just made to children in the past but also to us. With the Triune God to help us, it is our responsibility to live together as brothers and sisters in Christ. Deuteronomy reminds us of the various moments in our history when God's involvement with us was evident. It tells us that from creation to Moses, to the promised land, God's presence, and involvement in the lives of his people are evident. As we celebrate the Triune God, we pray for the grace to keep the commandments of God by fixing our heart on the Lord God and keep our relationship with him. We are mandated to bring our experience of God as Father-Parent, Brother-Sibling, and Spirit, to everyone we meet. May God help us to realize our unity of love in Him, our Triune God. AMEN!







