TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

September 5, 2021

"He [Jesus] put His finger into the man's ears and, **spitting**, touched his tongue;" Mark 7:33

Please allow Jesus to heal you, in His special way!

In the Gospel readings (Mark 7:31-37) Jesus is in Decapolis [a district of 10 cities]. The people, we are told, brought to Jesus a deaf man who had a speech impediment. They begged Him to lay His hand on the man. Jesus took the man aside from the crowd **privately**, then "He put His finger into the man's ears and, **spitting**, touched his tongue; then He looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, 'Ephphatha!'--that is, 'Be opened!' Mark 7:33-34. We are told that **immediately** the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly as he should. The crowd wanted Jesus to heal the deaf man by traditional means. Noticed they begged Jesus to lav His hand on the man so he could be healed. Jesus didn't listen to the crowd but took the man off **privately.** Jesus then **spit** and touched the man's tongue. Jesus used His spittle in the healing process. Here in the West, many of us would perhaps think that Jesus' action of spitting was nasty, dirty, vile, disrespectful, unclean, or even gross.

Jesus taught that His ways are different from ours. Jesus told His disciples to forgive those who wronged them (Luke 17:3-4). The traditional response would be to get even, but forgiveness would bring healing. Someone came to me and explained they were hurt and bitter and wanted to pay the other person back for what they did. I told the person that trying to get even would not heal them of the bitterness. Jesus' special way to bring healing to that hurt area in their life was to forgive. On Wednesday, August 11, 2021, at 5:30 in the morning I watched my mother take her last breath. I thought her funeral would be the following week, but the VA Cemetery couldn't bury her for 2 weeks, because they were so booked. As I was waiting to have her funeral

and burial I was grieving. I had little to no appetite. The Lord took me aside privately and told me what to do. I had to minister to others in their difficulty while I was hurting and in pain. On Wednesday, August 18, 2021, I went on our church's monthly home visits to the sick and shut-in of our parish. I normally would visit 5-7 parishioners, but because of a schedule conflict I took the 7 parishioners that our Pastor was to visit. I had a total of 14 parishioners to see. My assistant who helps me called to say she couldn't make it this month. During the visits, heavy rain had begun to fall. After several hours of visits, I finally finished and returned home. When I arrived, I went into Mom's room (as I normally had done for so many years) and told her I was back home and I missed her dearly.



the day of Mom's funeral (Tuesday, August 24, 2021) Jesus' healing power was there to greet me as I watched them roll Mom's casket into the church. That same power met me in the pulpit as I cried and preached the homily; and it was there at the VA Cemetery for the interment. I honestly believe that the healing process and power started while I was obediently visiting the sick and shut-ins. It became evident and manifested on the day of the funeral. Please allow Jesus to heal you, in His special way! <>< Den. Jenkins
