Called to Prophesy

Many of us Christians believe in the prophetic mission of God. We acknowledge that all are called to work in different ways in the Lord's vineyard. However, we waste no time in letting others know that this is an exclusive mission and that things are done only in a certain way. We do this by the way we talk and act. We expect new commers to be trained and initiated into the group before they "prophesy" as a member of the group.

At an annual church bazaar, a pastor was called to the kitchen to settle a dispute that could potentially mar the whole bazaar. The dispute was about different styles of cutting and cooking the vegetables. The kitchen leader and her group have over the years mastered a style of doing things their way. But the new volunteers have come up with different approaches. The dispute over the differences spilled into other areas of work in the kitchen. The new volunteers felt unwelcomed and were ready to walk out. The old volunteers were thinking that the new ones have not known the system enough to introduce another approach, even if they were warranted. They felt despised by the newcomers and so objected to their new style.

The delicate dance between the new and old happens all the time in almost every organization. As the saying goes: We all want change as long as they do not have to involve me. No one is perceived as good enough until he/she has earned the spot.

Unfortunately, this exclusive behavior has extended to our Christian movement. For example, the Catholic Church for centuries has been unnerved by the free movement of the Spirit. The Church has been suspicious of others who call on Jesus' name, especially to get rid of evil. Why? Because they do not profess the Catholic faith and neither have they risen within the ranks of believers as Jesus' recognized disciples.

Today we are invited to look beyond the limits we have set for ourselves and think of how God's prophetic sprit is poured out freely on all people. This Spirit of God calls us at will to be open to others who have received God's gifts, speak truth to power, and to be self-reflective for the sake of fostering and maintaining right relationships with all people.

Scriptures remind us that no one person or group enjoys monopoly of the spirit. As seen in our first reading, having been accustomed to his leadership and the way he mediated with God on behalf of his people, the Israelites accepted that Moses was endowed with God's spirit. For the most part, the people accepted Moses's counsel and

directions. But when the Spirit was made manifest through others, the Israelites questioned Medad's and Eldad's right to prophesy.

On their journey through the Sanai desert, the Israelites became disgruntled travelers. Frightening in the unfriendly wilderness, they repeatedly complained to God and to Moses, e.g., for their lack of food and water. Although they have been slaves in Egypt, the rigorous conditions of their journey made them reminisce for the "good old days in Egypt" where they filled themselves with fish, and cucumbers, melons, leeks onions and garlic (Num 11:15). Like a burned-out leader (Num 11:14-15), even Moses began to see his role as a burden that he alone had to carry. God intervened and awakened His spirit in other leaders who the people had chosen. From their experience, the people believed that God's Spirit follows certain protocols. Thus, the surprise when God's spirit moved outside the Tents and moved free and could not be controlled or monopolized or manipulated. The Spirit came upon Eldad and Medad who were not in the Meeting Tent. Representing the sentiments of the Israelites, Joshua objected to the freelancing spirit. To this objection Moses responded with a wish that the Spirit could be given to everyone. Jesus made real Moses' answer when he told John and his companions not to prevent anyone who performs mighty deeds in the name Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

This attempt to stifle the free movement of the Holy Spirit is repeated in our Gospel reading. John, representing the rest of the disciples, informed Jesus how they too tried to stop someone not in their company from driving out demons in Jesus' name.

Before the Second Vatican Council, when the Spirit of God moved and breathe among people in a manner different from what was expected, it was felt as a breach of protocol. Such movement was vehemently opposed and rejected. So, the church taught as a doctrine that "outside the Church, no salvation". It took the Church Council in the 1960s to nullify this teaching.

This wish of Moses became realized when the Holy Spirit breathe on all in the upper room and beyond freely and without bias or prejudice by the Risen Lord. To help us avoid trying to limit the promptings of the Holy Spirit and avoid scandals but lead others to God and holiness rather than to sin, Jesus teaches us to forgo our intimate sins. Since so many of the choices we make are filled with challenges, Jesus asks us to fortify ourselves with prayer and the Holy Spirit will help us with all that is good, true, just and holy when we prophesy.


