Luke 11:9 Jesus assures us that if we ask, God will take care of what we need. The problem is that our culture often confuses what we really need with what we simply want. The truth is that many of us need very little. However, we usually want so much more! Stewardship is simply being grateful for all that we are and all that we have been given, and generously sharing all of our God-given gifts with others. Generosity is a gift that opens doors to new relationships with others and with God.

Reflection on the Readings

In our own life experiences, we have come to know how friends can get familiar with each other. Familiarity creates the free space for friends to communicate. Abraham welcomed into his tent strangers which happened to be God and his angels. He prepared a meal for them, and they all ate together. Intimacy was established in this act of eating with strangers. If Abraham had reduced God to a mere ideology, he would not have treated his guests with such kindness. But Abraham knew God is real and alive. So, Abraham's deeds won him familiarity with God so that he could now speak freely with God. He pleaded with God for mercy upon Sodom and Gomorrah which were about to be destroyed for the sins of depravity and immorality. The long persistent conversation between Abraham and God was only possible because of the intimacy that Abraham had formed with God. God granted Abraham's requests but as we read in the story, not even ten righteous men were found to save the cities from destruction. God already knew that there were no righteous men left in the city, but he continued dialogue with Abraham. This is evidence that God listens to our prayers, and he will listen to all that we say to him. God never gets tired of dialoguing with us, no matter how long the dialogue.

But how is it possible to develop a close relationship with God in the midst of all the evil things that we are experiencing in our world these days? How do we remain focused on God with the conflicting political ideas, the moral crises in our world and the different economic and health challenges that each day presents to us? Jesus Christ supplies the answer. Jesus himself has an intimate relationship with the Father. which Jesus' disciples noticed. Jesus was calling God his father; this amazed his disciples. They then asked Jesus to teach them how to pray to God in such an intimate way. The disciples as Jews, knew how to pray. They now wanted a deeper relationship as Jesus did with his father. Jesus taught them to call God their Father because Jesus has made them his adopted brother. In the words of St. Paul, we can call God "Abba", Father, because of the spirit of adoption which we received through Christ (Rom. 8:15). This is the familiarity we are talking about, because Christ has become our brother and God is our father, and so we have an intimate relationship between us and God, like Jesus and God. Since God is so awesome, we cannot call his name, so whatever your name is, we say holy be your name and then we pray for the kingdom in heaven to be realized on earth. We then ask for forgiveness in the measure that we forgive others. We then ask for our daily sustenance and we pray that he may deliver us from the final test. Which father could hand his son a snake if the son had requested for fish? Not even the most wicked person gives their child poison instead of food. How much more will our Father in heaven grant our requests in his everlasting love. God will grant every single petition we present to him since we are his adopted children. Do our prayers sometimes seem to be unanswered? Yes, they do. But this does not mean God will not answer our prayers, he always answers our prayers in his own time just as our parents answer our requests at the appropriate time. Sometimes it is the way we pray or the intention of our prayers that delay our answers. Christ teaches us to pray persistently without stopping. Ask until you receive, knock until the door is opened, seek until you find. God is always waiting to hear our prayers, so keep asking him to answer you. Therefore, pray and pray and pray and the Lord will answer you! Amen.




