Today's readings are a wonderful antidote to our culture's attitude that the accumulation of material wealth should be everyone's goal. "Vanity

of vanities," this notion is, for what guarantee is there that you will ever be able to enjoy all the wealth you worked for? Greed is idolatry, Paul says in the next reading; instead seek what is above. After all, Jesus points out in the Gospel, the rich man is a fool for thinking he can control the rest of his life through wealth. May today's readings offer a strong argument against the worship of material possessions.

The Gospel message is contrary to modern culture that continually tries to convince us that our joy comes from the material things we possess. That the more we acquire, the happier we will be. Jesus shows us that our true joy comes from our "invisible" gifts like love, mercy and forgiveness. True joy comes from "emptying" ourselves, giving of ourselves rather than always taking. We are called not to hoard but to share. True joy comes from living a grateful and generous lifestyle; become more "Godcentered" and less "self-centered."

Hoarding Up Treasure for Oneself is Madness

My dear family of God, one thing that commonly describes those society labeled "mad people" is where they live as their home, their sleeping place. Their places of abode are crowded with things they don't really need. Society refers to "mad people" as people who lost their minds". However, the theme for this Sunday teaches us that hoarding is madness. Hoarding is amassing wealth, material things for only ourselves and perhaps family members. Sometimes we think we are justified for hoarding for our families, especially our children. Hoarding normally begins with the idea that, "Let me secure and prepare the future for myself and/or my children. But no! Success is neither securing nor preparing the future for ourselves and our children, but rather, securing and preparing ourselves and children for the future.

The most important idea in the Gospel is that the soul is a gift of God. The soul is never a gift from God but a gift of God. A gift from God, first, indicates that man is a receiver, as if there was man before the soul was given. It also indicates that man could be without the soul. The third is more dangerous, it separates the gift from the giver. But if the soul is a gift of God, then man is a gift of God. Now here is the paradox: A man does not possess what he possessed but what he has given out or shared.

The rich fool, like many of us, forgets that the soul is a gift and can only possess what is given. The soul doesn't feed on what we feed on, the body does, but on the gifts we have given. Whatever you keep or store for yourself is for your body not your soul. Fr. Raniero Cantalamessa in his book "Come, Creator Spirit" was right when he said, "When the moment of our death is upon us, all that will remain to us is what we have given. For in being given it is transformed into something eternal. He added, "Whatever is not given is lost, because as we ourselves must one day die, all that we clung to, to the very end, will die with us, but what we have given away will escape corruption for it has been sent ahead into eternity."

The Gospel reading describes what we clung to, to the very end as vanity. Whatever the rich man achieved was vanity because he clung to them. Even when his old barns sent him the signal that he needed to share or give out some of his farm produce he failed to listen to them. What about ourselves? We hoard material things in the name of living a good life and end up destroying the good life God has given us by the same material things. That too, is vanity.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading what to do to overcome hoarding, covetousness. We have to set our minds (meaning our souls) on things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. It means we have to set our minds on Christ seated at the right hand of the Father. And this is the father-son relationship Fr. Michael Buchman taught us about last Sunday. We would not be able to share nor give to others unless we break the wall between Greek and Jews, circumcised and uncircumcised, slave and free man, Black and White, and Black and Latino. And the only way to break the wall is when God becomes "Our Father" to each one of us. Then we begin to see each other as another of us, brothers and sisters.

My dear family of God, the readings re-defined what madness actually is. Madness is synonymous with losing the soul. And losing the soul is directly related to hoarding. When we keep hoarding, we starve our souls to death, because the soul does not feed on what we eat, but on what is giving out. Hoarding suffocates the soul. For example, we breathe in oxygen from the environment and breathe out carbon dioxide into the environment. Hoarding is like breathing in the very carbon dioxide we breathe out; it suffocates the soul. But when we give out or share the carbon dioxide produced by us with the environment it comes back to us as oxygen which is life. Hoarding poisons the soul while giving gives life to the soul. It does not matter the value of what we hoard: That too is vanity.
