"He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit""

Happy Sunday Brothers and Sisters! Happy Feast of Pentecost! Today, we celebrate the birthday of the Church. On the Pentecost, Jesus sends the Holy Spirit down into His Disciples to begin the work of the Church. He breathed on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. This Church that Christ created is often referred to as the Body of Christ. The reason it is the Body of Christ is because we, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, continue the physical work of Christ here on earth.

Last week we celebrated Christ's ascension into heaven. Christ's physical body ascended into heaven where He took His seat at the right hand of God, the Father. In the Gospel of John, Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit upon the disciples after His resurrection. He does it twice in our readings today. He sends the Holy Spirit in the Gospel reading from John when, in the upper room, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit". The Holy Spirit was sent again to the Apostles in the first reading today on the feast of Pentecost. In Acts, chapter 2, it says the Apostles were gathered together in one place. Acts describe a strong, driving wind and "tongues as of fire" that rested on each of them. Then Acts goes on to say that "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."

The Spirit of the master, Jesus, rested upon the disciples and filled them with the gifts of the Spirit. And once they had the gifts of the Holy Spirit, they had the courage to go out and preach about Jesus. It is this same Holy Spirit that is in us and can give us the courage we need as witnesses of the faith.

God loves us all and gives us gifts, no matter who we are, where we come from, or what our position is in life. We don't earn God's favor but receive it freely. St Paul talks about those gifts in today's second reading when he says, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone". He goes on to say that "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit".

This means that the <u>one</u> Holy Spirit provides us with different gifts for doing God's work in the world. How many of us have the gifts that God has given us, but we don't use it for his work? Maybe we worry about what the world thinks instead of what pleases God. Maybe we are too centered on ourselves to share our gifts with others. Or maybe we lack the courage to let the controls go and allow the Holy Spirit to guide us.

St Paul gave us a great example of how to do this. He says in Acts, chapter 20, "But now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem. What will happen to me there I do not know, except that in one city after another the Holy Spirit has been warning me that imprisonment and hardships await me. Yet I consider life of no importance to me, if only I may finish my course and the ministry I received from the Lord Jesus, to bear witness to the Gospel of God's grace." This is powerful brothers and sisters. Paul was willing to let go of the controls and

allow the Holy Spirit to lead him.

We are like a house and the Holy Spirit wants to dwell in us and guide us. But He can't if our house is cluttered. Our clutter is our ego, desire for power, selfishness, immoral behavior, etc. Here is an example of how our house can be cluttered and stifle the Holy Spirit from leading us and guiding us. Many years ago, when I was a relatively new Lector, I was nervous and had a fear of messing up. I had a fear of stumbling or mispronouncing words or reading too fast or too slow. I was supposed to try to look-up ever so often to give eye contact. Why did I have a need to be flawless? Because it was about me. Brothers & sisters, it was about me and not about Him. I was worried about not making mistakes because I was worried about what others may think or say. It was my ego that became more important than proclaiming His word. What was interesting about it is I didn't even realize it. Sometimes when you add clutter in your house over time, you don't really realize how cluttered it is. I had answered God's call to be a Lector and said yes for the right reasons. But that ego crept-in on me and I didn't realize it. I read a book quite a few years ago about lawyers and how they argue in court. The book suggested that the lawyers who were a little rough around the edges, maybe even stumble in their delivery were more effective with juries than the smooth polished ones. The jury could connect better with those who were more like them.

So, back to my Lector example, the good news brothers and sisters, is that God helped me see the clutter and enabled the Holy Spirit to come in and guide me. I started saying this prayer every time before I stood up to proclaim. I asked Jesus to hold my hand and go with me to proclaim His word. I asked him to allow me to proclaim His word in a way pleasing to him. I asked Him to remove any distractions, let me get out of the way, and put my trust and faith in Him. And again, when I did this, I wasn't worried about making a mistake or stumbling.

Sometimes when we go visit the sick, do we rehearse the right words to say or the right things to do? No, most of the time, we just go to love and serve that person and the Holy Spirit will guide us. And again, the Holy Spirit can guide us if we clean our house and go for the right reasons. It's the right reason if we are going to love them as Jesus loved us. In John's gospel a few weeks ago, Jesus said "love one another as I have loved you".

Now, you may wonder, what can clutter our house and have us go visit the sick for maybe not the right reasons? One way is if we go out of the feeling of obligation. Or we go because a family member demands that we need to go. Or we go so we can look like a Good Samaritan to other people. In this example, it is ego raising its head again. When we sing in the choir, if we hit a bad note, we can rejoice and thank Him for giving us that voice to sing. God is happy with the good notes and the bad notes. The Holy Spirit joins us when we visit those in prison. He guides us when we help the homeless. The Holy Spirit intercedes on our behalf if we are out in the world doing His works of mercy. Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, gave us the Holy Spirit at Pentecost so that we may bear His fruit. At the ascension, His physical body left this earth, but He is physically still here on earth through us. We are to love like Christ loved us. We are Jesus' hands and feet in the world. Jesus says in John's Gospel, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." It is through our love that we can bring the world back to Christ. I pray that the Holy Spirit gives each of us the strength and guides each of us to love and serve Him and others and to follow His will.






