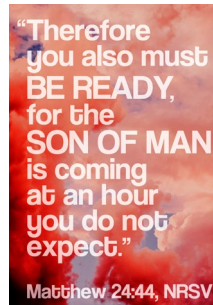

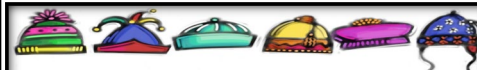

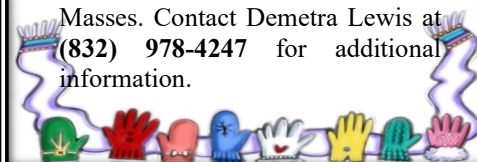

Stay Awake!

First Sunday of Advent, Year A

Is 2:1-5/ Ps 122: 1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9/ Rom 13:11-14/ Mt 24:37-44

Today we begin a new liturgical year with the season of Advent. This is the first Sunday of Advent, Year A. Advent simply means “coming.” During this season we prepare and await the coming of the Lord, both at Christmas and the Second Coming.

In the First Reading from the prophet Isaiah, the prophet describes a future event in which “the mountain of the Lord’s house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills.” And because of its prominence, “All nations shall stream toward it.”

The streaming of all nations toward the Lord’s house creates an imagery of a people on pilgrimage. If we are talking of all nations, then it goes beyond the borders of ancient Israel to include all peoples on earth. This means that all of us, we the new People of God, are on a pilgrimage.

These people who are on pilgrimage, gravitating toward Mount Zion, have these words on their lips: “Come, let us climb the Lord’s mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths.” Why are they going to the house of the God of Jacob? Two reasons: 1. That they may be instructed in God’s ways, and, 2. That they may walk in his paths. In other words, they are not only eager to learn from the Lord, but they are also ready to put the word into practice. St James will say, “Be doers of the word, and not hearers only” (1:22).

Hearing and doing the word bring about transformation and renewal. There is no doubt that if humanity, especially Christians, would take the word of God seriously and live by it, there would be less violence, hatred and the many vices that plague the world.

The transformation that comes from putting the word of God into practice is seen in the First Reading where we are told that the pilgrims “shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again” (Isaiah 2:4). This is a powerful picture of complete peace.

It is so unfortunate to note that humanity has recorded more periods of conflict than peace. It is shocking the amount of money nations spend on armaments and instruments of death. There is competition among nations as to who has the latest state of the art weapons. It is frightening to say that, now the most dangerous creature is not the lion or the tiger, but humanity.

Now more than ever, we continue to look forward to that day, when humanity will come back to the realization that the solution to lasting peace is putting the word of God into practice and beating our swords into plowshares and other productive machinery that would help eliminate the structures of injustice and poverty.

St Paul tells us in the Second Reading of his letter to the Romans, “it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep” (13:11). It is as if he wants to literally say, “enough is enough.” Let us throw off the works of darkness. We are children of Christ the light. There is no way we can claim to belong to Christ and continue to persist in works of darkness.

Jesus says, “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life” (John 8:12). And those who walk in the light of Christ conduct themselves well, “not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy” (Romans 13:13). They “put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh” (Romans 13:14).

Based on what has been said above, it is important that we stay vigilant at all times. We should be careful not to behave like the people in the days of Noah. They were so inattentive to the prophetic dealings of Noah that they missed the opportunity of salvation. At the end the flood came and carried them all.

Jesus says in the Gospel Reading according to Matthew, “So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man” (24:39). The coming of the Son of Man will be at an unknown day and an unknown hour. This, then, calls for a state of continuous alertness.

The need to be always vigilant is reemphasized by Jesus’s statement that, “Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come” (Matthew 24:42).

This season of Advent offers us the opportunity to take a sober look at our state of preparedness for the coming of the Lord. After all, in Advent, one of the popular words we hear is, “Maranatha,” meaning, “Come, Lord.”

It is a deep yearning within our hearts, asking the Lord to come and relieve us of our pains and sufferings, and usher in the new Jerusalem where, “He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away” (Rev 21:4).

As we prepare during this Advent for the two comings of the Lord, may he continue to sustain us with his grace and fill our hearts with his joy and peace.

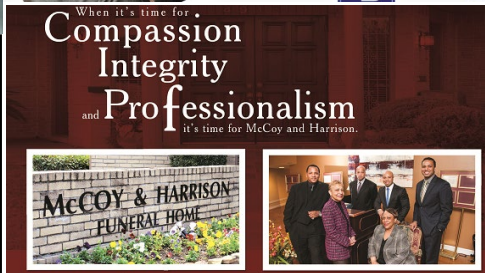

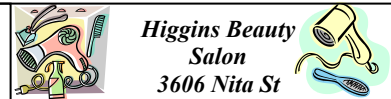

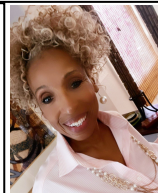
