Jesus is looking out for you

The First Reading from the book of Wisdom talks of God's greatness and mercy. It states, "Before the LORD the whole universe is as a grain from a balance, or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth" (Wis 11:22). This should set us thinking for a while.

Consider the vastness of the universe. Imagine the galaxy, the systems of stars and interstellar matter that make up the universe. They are so enormous that they contain hundreds of billions of stars. That notwithstanding, these are as grain or a drop of morning dew before God.

Humanly speaking, and based on human logic, we would assume that a being of such greatness should lord it over others in order to make his power felt. This is so true of some people who assume some prominence in society and all of a sudden begin to put on airs and even look down upon people they previously associated with. This is so unfortunate.

Fortunately for all of us, God is God, and not man. He says it himself, "I am God, and not a man" (Hos 11:9). For this reason, even though he is great, God continues to look upon humanity with mercy.

Our First Reading continues by saying, "...you have mercy on all, because you can do all things; and you overlook people's sins that they may repent" (Wis 11:23). Indeed, our God is a God of mercy and compassion. His mercy is beyond human understanding. Therefore, his greatest joy is when we continually turn to him in repentance, asking for forgiveness and the grace to do better.

Since he created us in his own image and likeness, there is no way God will deny us of this grace of repentance. The sacred writer says, "But you spare all things, because they are yours, O LORD and lover of souls, for your imperishable spirit is in all things!" (Wis 11:26-12:1)

It is so heartwarming to hear the writer describe God as a lover of souls. Indeed, "God is love" (1 John 4:8). He shares this love with us and does not stop loving us even when we offend him. God's love is unconditional, and it is available to all. Whereas human beings may refuse to love others for one reason or another, God, on the other hand, cannot stop loving.

We see this universal and unconditional love of God for humanity exemplified in the Gospel Reading, in the beautiful story of Jesus's encounter with Zacchaeus the chief tax collector. The tax collectors in those days were regarded as traitors and public sinners. This is because they worked for the Romans who occupied Jerusalem.

It is said that they usually collected more from the people than required by law. In that sense, they kept the rest of the money to themselves. In other words, they were milking their own people. What public sinners! No wonder Luke describes Zacchaeus as "a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man" (19:2). The interesting twist to this story is that this public sinner was also seeking to see who Jesus was. This clearly demonstrates the importance of never giving up on people. Only God knows the yearnings of the heart, even in the heart of the hardened criminal. And so long as people are alive, there is hope for everyone.

The challenge Zacchaeus had that stopped him, albeit momentarily, from seeing Jesus is that "he was short in stature," and that was made worse with the presence of the crowd. But, as they say, where there is a will there is a way. Zacchaeus was short in stature but not short in faith.

His determination to overcome his impediment, and assisted by the grace of God, made Zacchaeus run ahead and climbed a sycamore tree so that he could see Jesus. Maybe we can pause here and ask ourselves how much time and energy we invest in our quest to know and see Jesus. What length would we go? As far as Zacchaeus's? We pray so.

Whereas Zacchaeus wanted to see Jesus, Jesus, on the other hand, had already seen him. Therefore, "When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, 'Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house."" God of wonders!

Zacchaeus was seeking a glance of Jesus and his aspiration was fulfilled by the honor of hosting him. All the Lord requires of all of us is willing and open hearts. He says, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in and dine with him, and he with Me" (Rev 3:20). This was fulfilled in the life of Zacchaeus.

This experience of the chief tax collector with Jesus brought the best out of him. Jesus did not mention his sins, he did not condemn him. He simply loved and showed him that he is worthy of God's love. At the end of the day, Zacchaeus himself made a public confession without shame.

He said, "Half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone, I shall repay it four times over." This is a sign of true and genuine conversion. It was devoid of threats of hell and violence. In fact, every true and genuine conversion should be a response to a true and genuine love. And this is what we see in the Gospel Reading.

Let us then be encouraged by the readings of today. Simply bear in mind that God loves you and he wants you to love him back. No matter your situation, no matter your past, if you open up to him like Zacchaeus, he will welcome you and embrace you. After all, he said it himself that, "The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost" (Luke 19:10).


