


## Did you know that Catholics can make an Act of Spiritual Communion?

"'Here I am!' he answered." - Genesis 22:11 It is easy to say, "Here I am, Lord," when we are kneeling in church. But how easy is it to say, "Here I am, Lord," when a neighbor needs our help, or when we are invited to join a parish ministry, or when we are asked to provide financial support? Often times we are called when it's not convenient for us. Discipleship is not easy, most of the time it will make us uncomfortable and vulnerable.

## SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (B)

February 25, 2024

Last Sunday the gospel reading recalled before us a testing time in the life of Jesus with Satan, an experience of struggle in the wilderness. Deacon Drenon reminded us, that we share in the wilderness suffering of Jesus. Whether we are struggling in this moment of life or we are on the mountaintop, we still need to unite with Jesus. We encounter Jesus today in a very different place in his life. Most of us find it easier to identify with Jesus in the wilderness, this is the kind of experience that we usually have in our lives. Painful experiences have a way of staying with us long after we have moved on from them. But Jesus wants us to have transforming faith-filled experiences with him.

This Sunday the gospel reading presents us with a very different moment in Jesus' life, a time when his experience of God, his Heavenly Father calling his name in love and instructed us to listen to him. Jesus experienced this encounter of transfiguration with God. Today's gospel reading, however, invites us to recall our mountain-top experiences that we have had in the course of life's journey. These are the times when, in the words of Peter in today's gospel reading, we say, 'it is good we are here'. So, exactly what was it about his experience on the mountain that made Peter say that?

Our answer would be that the glory of God shone through Jesus in a way that had never happened before. On the mountain top those with Jesus, had an experience of God's presence. We can safely say that they had a little taste of heaven. The experience was so wonderful that they did not want to come down the mountain, no more I believe, than our loved ones in heaven would want to come back to this earth. If we take the time to reflect on those experiences in our own lives that made us say, 'it is wonderful for us to be here', we can be assured in some way we have had an experience of God. We don't necessarily have to go up to Texas Hill Country to have such experiences. We can be fortunate enough to experience something of God's loving presence in and through the people that cross our path in life. God can touch our lives in ways that do not directly involve other people.

Time on our own in the presence of creation can leave us with a really deep feeling of wonderment and gratitude. Our heart tells us, 'It is good for us to be here'. When happiness of heart is contentment, we encounter God more intimately. Martin Luther King in his last speech before he died felt this contentment, as he ended with the final sentence "Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord. These sorts of experiences are ultimately experiences with Gods love.

As we are directed by the Lord Jesus, (Matthew 6:5-6), to spend time alone in quiet prayer. The Lenten season encourages us to take this time so we can be aware of God's presence. It will leave us with a sense of being deeply loved, in spite of the pain and loss we may be experiencing in our daily life. Any experience of God, any life-giving and life-affirming experience, is ultimately an anticipation of the Kingdom of Heaven alive in God's presence. At our baptism, when the Spirit is cast over us, we are set out on our journey of faith and at the end of that journey when God call us home, is our transfiguration is complete. On our journey to Salvation, hopefully we will have our own experience with God; we will experience grace-filled moments as Abraham did in our First Reading from Genesis. Even though God tested his faith on the mountain top, he also gave him a lifetime experience of God's love. Even though Martin would die the next day, he experienced the Glory of God in his faithfulness. I can assure you that you are more likely to have such graceful moments if we do what was asked of Peter, James and John on the mountain, if we listen to the voice of Jesus. When we are attentive enough to our listening heart, which will allow us to be touched by the divine reality that God is constantly with us in all things if we allow Him to be present continuously in our lives.


