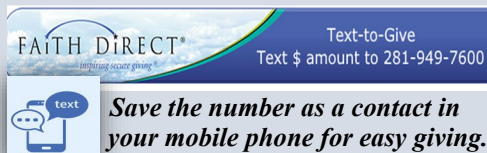

We are only made perfect through purification, and in Catholic teaching, this purification, if not completed on earth, is continued in a transitional state we call purgatory. The guidelines in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston allows for only **one (1) Mass Intention per Mass**. Many of the dates that you have requested for Mass Intentions in 2024 could not be accommodated under these stipulations. We have moved your Intentions to the next available date. 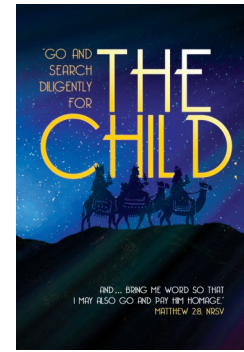

## *All Are Welcome*

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. This is one of the oldest feasts in the Church Calendar. Most probably, the Church celebrated the Epiphany even before it celebrated the Nativity, at Christmas. There are three epiphanies recognized by the Church: the manifestation of the Lord to the magi, the baptism of the Lord by John the Baptist, and the first public miracle in the Gospel of John, the changing of water into wine. The Eastern Catholic Churches and the Orthodox Churches celebrate all three Epiphanies together as one event. The Western Catholic Church, the Roman Catholic Church, divides up these celebrations into three liturgical celebrations. Our focus today is on the magi. Who were these men, sometimes called kings? We don't know a whole lot about them.

The main thing we know is that they were not Jewish. And this is significant. A few days after the birth of the Lord, gentiles, pagans, were summoned to follow a star to Israel where the One that had been waited for throughout the ages was born. They followed the star because they were good people honestly seeking God's will. It must have been quite a sight when they arrived in Israel. They were foreigners, but not just any foreigners. They held positions powerful enough for them to merit an audience with Herod. Herod was troubled by their visit, and with him all of Jerusalem. Who were these men, and what did they want from their king.

They inquired not about Herod, but to give homage to the newborn king of the Jews. There was a baby out there somewhere who would replace Herod? And this is when the trouble started. The chief priests and scribes of Israel could only tell Herod about the ancient prophecy that a ruler would come from Bethlehem. If these three magi, in their own time were considered kings, and they could create such a stir in Jerusalem, imagine what it had to be like when they arrived in Bethlehem, paid respect to Herod and then went to the house by now, where Mary, Joseph and Jesus were staying. Even more amazing, these rich pagans prostrated themselves before the child Jesus and gave him gifts: gold, frankincense and myrrh. Why would rich pagans be interested in the Jewish Messiah we might ask?

This encounter happened so that the gentiles could be accepted as part of God's plan for His people. All people was to be saved beyond the consideration of the Jews alone. But the mystery that had been hidden for generations was now revealed: the gentiles were to be co-heirs with the Jews, members of the same body, co-partners in the promise of Jesus Christ, as Paul proclaims in today's second reading from Ephesians. Jesus Christ came for all people. None were to be excluded from the Grace of God that He would bring. We, Catholics, people whose very name means universal, must be careful that we recognize that all people are called to the Grace of God given by Jesus Christ. It is so easy for us to exclude people. In fact, we have been trained by our society to compartmentalize people into various groups, by race, economics, social status, gender, etc.. We are told that the Jews behave this way. The Italians that way, the Irish another way, the Americans another, and Africans another way, and the French (well they) don't behave at all, just a joke(lol). We can easily decide who belongs worshiping the Lord and who really shouldn't be there. We prejudicially decide that whole groups of people must be immoral, unworthy and shouldn't enjoy the gifts of the Church.

Thank God no one, King Herod or the Israelite people had the right to exclude people from worshiping Jesus, Emmanuel, who is the Gift of Bethlehem and the World. In a similar way, we don't have the right to exclude people from receiving the charity of the Church. Jesus Christ brings us together as God intended, for us to be all one without prejudice, sisters and brothers in God's grace. We hear and respond to the profound voice of God to love one another. As we move from the Christmas season, let us resolve to be better Christians and be welcoming to all God's people.
