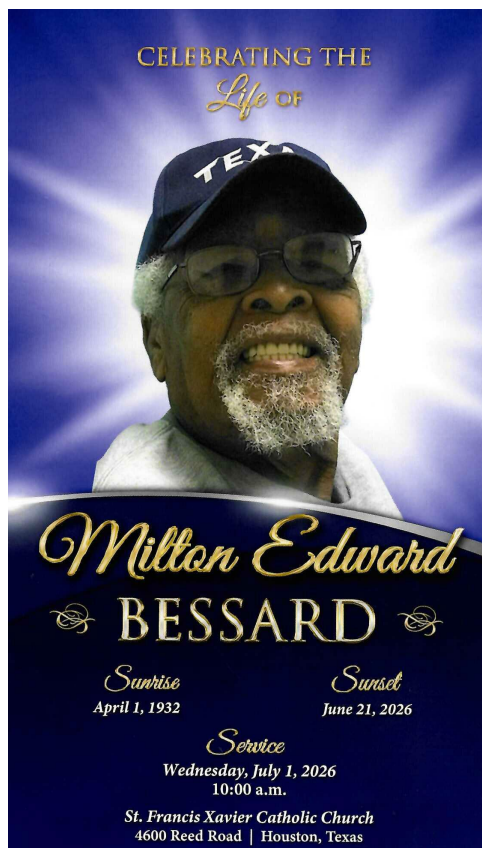

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sometimes when things are going against us, it can be difficult to be positive about anything. After several negative experiences we can be tempted to see everything with a veiled eye. Those experiences that leave us feeling angry, sad, hurt and disheartened can affect our ability to notice all that we still have reason to be grateful for. In life's journey we come across people occasionally who have little to nothing good to say about anyone or any situation. Perhaps they have had deeply negative experiences in life, and this has left them with a negative outlook on everything.

Jesus had particularly good reason to be negative about many of his contemporaries. Yet, the rejection and indifference that he repeatedly experienced with his own community did not leave him bitter. The negative experiences that he had did not blind him to all the good that was happening around him and for which he could be grateful. Having complained about the Scribes, the Pharisees, the High Priests, he then went on to give thanks and praise to God for all those who were responding to what God was doing in and through him. That is what we find Jesus doing in today's gospel reading. Many of those who would have been considered the least significant in the land were seeing what the wise and intelligent were failing to see; they were recognizing God's presence in Jesus. Jesus could say to this group, 'Come to me,' in the knowledge that they would respond. Jesus had that vision to recognize the signs of life in what seemed empty or dead. He was attuned to the mysterious ways in which God was working even when what was more obvious were the ways that people were turning away from God. Even after many negative experiences of failure and rejection, he knew that there were many reasons why God should be praised and thanked.

In St Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, he called on the church to give thanks in all circumstances. He did not say, give thanks for all circumstance, but, rather, in all circumstances. Certainly, this was true of Jesus; he gave thanks and praise at all times, even when there appeared

to be little reason for blessing and praising God. Unlike Jesus, we may be inclined to bless and praise God only when we feel that all is going well. We can be slow to see the workings of God in situations that fall short of our hopes and expectations. In our own personal lives, when we find ourselves struggling against the storms and obstacles in our lives, as I said in last week's homily, we might be tempted to think that God is absent. Yet, God is always at work, even in the most distressing experiences and in the most unpromising of situations. The readings today suggest that it is easy to miss the many ways that the Lord is moving among us. The prophet Zachariah in the first reading announced the arrival of a king who would come humble and riding on a donkey. People of that culture did not expect kings to ride on donkeys but on war horses. If they saw someone coming towards them on a donkey, they would never suspect that he was a king. Zechariah was suggesting to the people that God's messenger will come to them in very ordinary and, to many, very unpromising ways. As a result, they might fail to notice him when he is among them.

It is certainly hard to image anything less promising than a crucified man, and yet, in that man God was reaching out to humanity in love. The evangelists suggest that the Roman centurion was one of very few to recognize the powerful presence of God in this most bleak of moments. Indeed, Luke tells us that when the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God. He saw more deeply than most; he recognized that God was powerfully at work in this human being who was laboring and overburdened and so praise came from his heart and lips.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus assures us that he is especially near to us when we are laboring under the weight of some heavy burden. In those dark times when we might be tempted to think that the Lord has abandoned us, he is calling out to us to come to him. Even in such times, there is good reason, then, to praise and thank God. We should continue to pray for the spiritual eyes to see the signs of the Lord's presence in our own painful moments.

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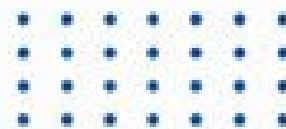

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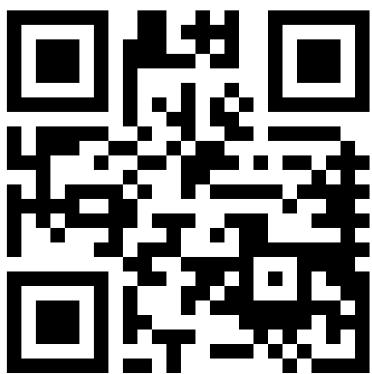
