In between, we hear Saint Paul’s advice to the Colossians: “seek what is above.” It’s too late for the rich man in Jesus’s parable, but it’s always timely advice for us.

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Reading from the Gospel of Luke teaches us that life does not consist in the abundance of possessions. A rich and meaningful life cannot be drawn out of an abundance of material possessions.

On this date, throughout the world, there will be a variety of reactions towards today's Gospel Reading. For some, the reading shall come as a shock. For they believe that all what counts in their lives is the accumulation of their assets, their houses, their properties, their financial investments, their cars, their cottages, their boats, etc...

Some might be deeply touched. They will perceive a calling to the Priesthood or Religious Life. Consequently, they will sell all their possessions, and they will join a Religious Order, like The Josephites, so they can accumulate spiritual riches through service. Some among the extremely rich, will prepare to enjoy their wealth at a later time, they might have their bodies frozen with cryogenics at once following their deaths in the hope of being resurrected at a later time when a cure can be found for their illnesses. Some, after the celebration of the Holy Mass and hearing the excellent sermon, they will go home and start working on their Last Will and burial arrangements. They will attempt to decide to who their wealth should be distributed to, sorting the wise from the fools. Then they will hope that after their death, their wish will be carried out, with no one challenging their Last Will in a Court of Law. For others, the Word of God will enter one ear and go out the other one. They have failed to perceive the spiritual wisdom of God in this Sunday readings.

Considering all these different reactions, it is obvious that possessions, although they are transient, worthless, and empty, they have a strange influence on the human mindset.

Today's First Reading from the Book of Ecclesiastes questioned what we as mortals get from all the toil and strain that we endure under the sun, when at death, we must leave everything behind for someone else to enjoy it. These people, they did not work for all that wealth that they inherit. That St Paul tells us is "vanity" in the sense of "worthlessness." What good is something if we cannot enjoy it? It is no different than the rich man who build large barns to store all his grain and his goods, in the hope of relaxing, eating, drinking and being merry. Then, on that very night, his life was demanded of him. In view of this, there is a reason to detest our hard labor. It is because we cannot take it with us, having to leave it to beneficiaries.

It is different for those who toil for spiritual labor. Their recompense is being accumulated in Heaven, their rewards waiting for them on judgment day. Their spiritual treasures will never be taken from them. Today's Second Reading affirms this. We heard

the teaching of Saint Paul, who said in His Letter to the Colossians, "Seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God."

Having been raised with Christ. In Him, we find the perfect image of God. Jesus is the perfect pattern of life for we who have been baptized. He is our reason for continuously seeking an interior renovation in His image as the new disciple with Christ as the head of a new humanity, the Christian community. Through Him, all the social barriers no longer stand between Gods people. Races, cultures, or state of life no longer divide us. There is no barrier in gender, male or female; in age, whether young or old; in social status, being rich or poor; in our medical conditions, one being healthy or sick, or even one being free or in prison. Christ breaks down such distinctions. He is all and in all. Christ is all that matters.




























Now, since life does not consist in the abundance of possessions, how do we accumulate spiritual treasures in Heaven? We accumulate spiritual treasures in Heaven by our acts of love towards others, by our acts of charity, through the goodness that we manifest towards our neighbors in the love of Jesus. What we do to others, we do to Christ.

How do we store our treasures in heaven? There are many ways of accumulating treasures in Heaven. Yes, there are! By giving alms, and acts of kindness, your deeds are recorded in Heaven. By helping the elders to get to Church on Sunday or by providing them with transportation so they can do their weekly shopping of groceries, such deeds are recorded in Heaven. By helping the handicaps with their special needs or by being a friend to the outcast, God will notice your goodness. These are just a few examples of many ways through which we can manifest love towards Jesus, by manifesting love towards our brothers and sisters.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus simply wants us to live out his instructions. "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust will consume them and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consume and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." [Mt. 6:19-21]

This week, by the grace of the Heavenly Father, the power of the Holy Spirit, in the Name of Jesus, let us move forward on our spiritual journey with a new outlook. May our commitment be, to accumulate as many treasures in Heaven as we can. In the end when we are called home to God, we can rest well assured that we will not regret anything we left behind.

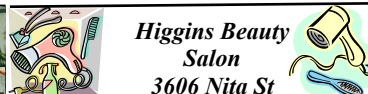
