TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A plan for resolving conflict is laid out in today's gospel. What isn't there, however, is any sort of a guarantee that all will go smoothly, that the correction will be welcomed and heeded. Suppose it isn't – what then? There are two options presented: hold onto grievance, binding ourselves to the perpetual judgment of someone and binding the offending individual to our anger; or to trust we have made our best effort and then let go in grace, freeing ourselves from the weight of anger and freeing the other for a possible encounter with those who may be able to offer what we could not. When we gather to discern in the name of Love, in the spirit of Mercy, in the light of Peace, Jesus is there, among us. The desire to both tell one's truth and listen authentically to the truth of another is no small thing. It takes vulnerability, curiosity, honesty, and a desire for the greatest good for the whole. Binding and loosing is not to be done casually.

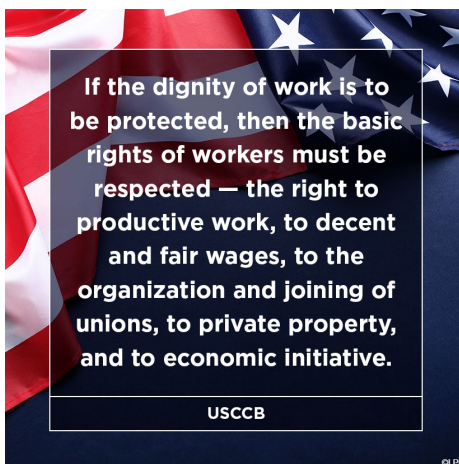
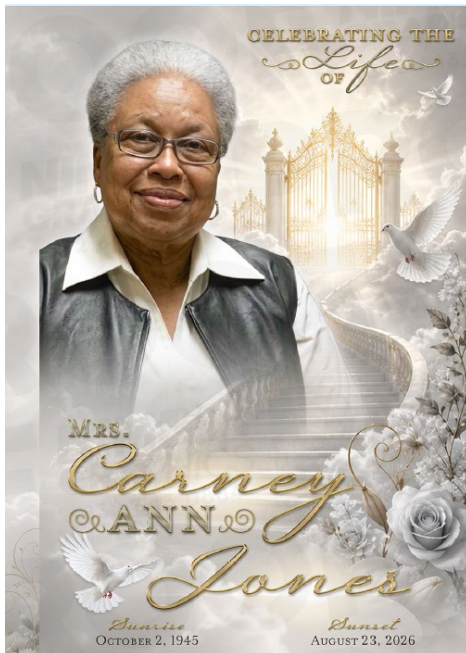

REV. ALEXANDER BARIAALA LEMA, SSI

Father Lema was born in Bodo, Rivers State, Nigeria on September 15, 1995. He first learned about the Josephites through the Missionaries of St. Paul, which partners with the Josephites in Nigeria. As he discerned a vocation to the priesthood, he felt called to missionary life in a religious community, and the Josephites commitment to social justice and ministry among African Americans further strengthened that call. He was admitted to the Josephite Formation Program in Nigeria in 2013 and later to the Formation Program in the USA in 2021. He received a Master of Divinity degree at The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. His Pastoral Interns have taken him to Sts. Raymond/Leo the Great, New Orleans, LA (2021), Corpus Christi/Epiphany Church, New Orleans, LA (2022), and Holy Family Church, Baytown, TX (2024). Father Lema served his Diaconate assignment at Our Lady of Grace Church in Reserve, LA., where he participated in religious education classes for children, moderated a young adult group and visited the sick and shut in. Father Lema was Ordained to the Priesthood on May 30, 2026, at Church of the Incarnation in Washington, DC. We welcome Father Lema to St. Francis Xavier Church and express our sincere gratitude that he said "Yes" to God's call to follow Jesus Christ as a priest!

Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted commentaries and homilies

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle A)

I am sure that most of us could name people who influenced us for the better during our lives. Many of us, in this regard, will think of our parents, or some teacher or a good friend or a sports coach. These are people who helped to bring the best out in us. They took an interest in us; they encouraged us when we needed encouragement, and they might have challenged us as well when we were losing the run of ourselves. Their challenging word was probably more difficult to hear than their encouraging word, but deep down we knew that both sets of words were coming from the same source, from a heart that cared and was interested. These people felt a certain sense of responsibility for us.

I am sure you are familiar with the story of Cain and Abel in the book of Genesis. After Cain killed Abel, the Lord said to Cain: 'Where is your brother?' and Cain replied, 'I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?' That question of Cain has echoed down through the ages, 'Am I my brother's or sister's keeper?' 'Am I responsible for others?' The message of the gospel is very clear that, in a very fundamental way, we are responsible for each other. We need, in a sense, to be looking out for each other. That strong gospel value is clear in the gospel reading today. A clear procedure is offered there for dealing with a member of the church, a fellow disciple in faith, or someone who has gone astray. In other words, it is taken for granted that if someone is clearly doing wrong, and, to that extent, is on a self-destructive course, it is the responsibility of everyone in the community to somehow bring that person to their senses.

The particular procedure for doing that, which the gospel reading suggests, is not necessarily one that we might be inclined to adopt today. However, what is still valid for us today is that, as fellow faithful pilgrims, we are, to some extent, responsible for each other, and we do need to be looking out for each other. None of us journeys to God alone. We travel that journey together, and we are dependent on each other to travel it well. As believers, we need the encouragement and the challenge that only other believers can provide.

It is serious to realize that we are called to bring each other to the Lord. There are many examples in the gospels of individuals who lived out that calling very fully. The

Samaritan woman comes to mind, one of my favorite gospel stories. Having met the Lord for herself, she left the well and went back to her town and started to bring other Samaritans to the well, to the Lord. What she did so well is what we are all called to do. The Lord worked through her to nurture faith in others. The Lord works through each of us to touch the lives of others, to draw others to him. In a sense, the Lord has made himself dependent on us. Yet, we are aware that as well as leading each other to the Lord, we can also block each other from making deeper contact with the Lord.

You remember last Sunday's gospel reading where Jesus addressed Peter as a stumbling stone. Peter, by his attitude, was effectively blocking Jesus from taking the path that God was calling him to take. When we look at Peter, all we can say is 'there but for the grace of God go I.' Any one of us can become a stumbling stone for another, or for several others. We can bring each other to the Lord or lead each other away from him. That is the awesome influence and responsibility that we have. In the gospels, Jesus is quite severe on those who prove a stumbling stone to others: In Matthew 18:6 Jesus says, 'If any of you put a stumbling stone before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth of the sea.' We need to be mindful of the influence that we have on each other's relationship with the Lord – an influence that can be for good or for bad.

As a priest/ pastor, I am obliged to respond generously to the Lord's call in my own life. Through my service to the Church and the people of God, I am building up the faith all those around me. When I turn away from the Lord's call in my own life, I am undermining their faith. When we do not live the values of the gospel, we are making it more difficult for others to do so. However, when we strive to live the values of the gospel, we are helping others to do the same, even if my living of the gospel appears to be bearing little fruit in others. Sometimes it is not given to us to see the fruit of our own efforts. Yet, we can be confident that to the extent that we allow Christ to live in us, we will also be creating a space for Christ Jesus to live in others.

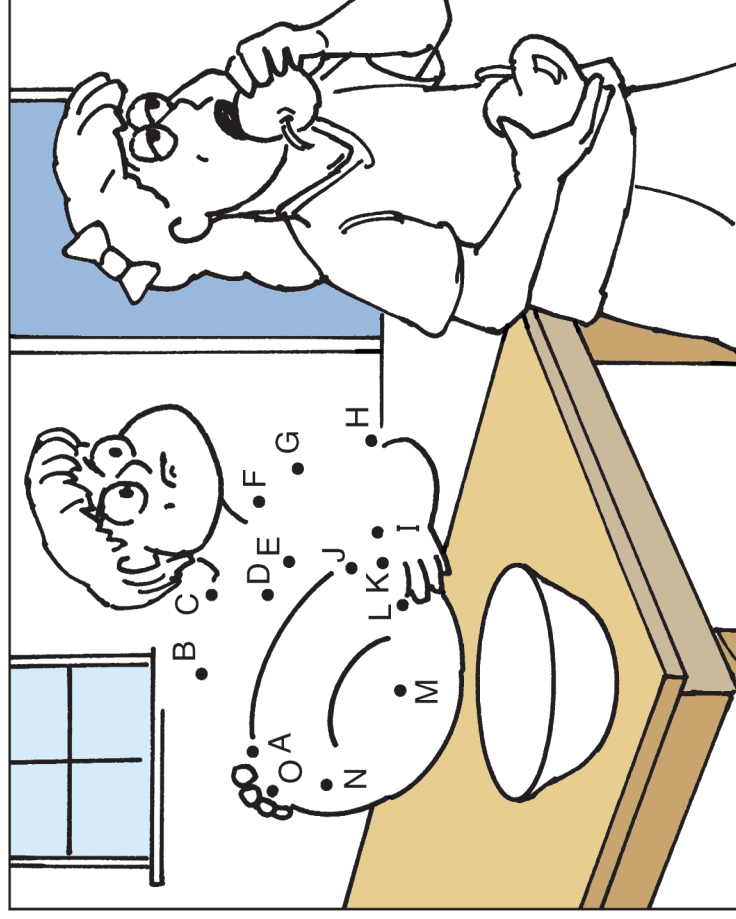
