# "When We Receive the Eucharist, We Carry Jesus With Us"

Happy Sunday! Today, the Church celebrates Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This feast is about more than bread and wine. It's about presence...real, living, divine presence. At every Mass, Jesus Christ offers Himself to us, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. We receive Him not as a symbol, but in truth. And when we receive Him in Holy Communion, we carry Him with us...into our families, our communities, our jobs, our struggles, our joys. Jesus doesn't remain on the altar. He enters into you. That's what we celebrate today. And that's what makes our Catholic faith so powerful. While many churches speak about Jesus, we receive Him. While many services recall His sacrifice, we encounter it...here and now...through the Eucharist. And when we say "Amen" before receiving Communion, we are saying, "Yes, Lord, I believe. I believe You are truly present. And I welcome You into my life."

But what do we do with Jesus once we've received Him? That's the challenge and the invitation of today's feast. We are not called to leave Jesus at the door of the Church or keep Him private like a personal possession. The Eucharist sends us out. It strengthens us to be His hands and feet in the world. It calls us to reflect His mercy, to walk in His truth, to share His love.

As Jesus says in John 6:56, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." Think about that. He abides in us. He walks with us. He works through us.

Brothers and sisters, we know what it means to carry Christ. Many of us come from strong faith traditions. We've seen God's hand in our families. We've overcome struggles with prayer and perseverance. Our ancestors trusted in the Lord when they had little else to hold onto. They went to Mass not just out of obligation, but out of

hunger...hunger for the Bread of Life.

That same hunger lives in us today. But in a world full of distractions, we sometimes forget just how precious the Eucharist is. It's easy to take it for granted or to treat Mass like something we "get through" instead of something we offer to God with reverence and love. But the truth is: we need this spiritual food. Just as we eat to stay physically alive, we receive Jesus to stay spiritually strong. Without Him, we run dry. We lose direction. We fall back into sin. But when we receive Him...when we really believe that we are taking in the Savior of the world...something changes. We are renewed. We are reminded of who we are and whose we

So what difference does it make when you receive the Eucharist?

- It means you're not walking alone. Jesus goes with you.
- It means you're not powerless. You have Christ alive within you.
- It means you've been given grace for whatever this week holds.
- It means that when you attend and leave Mass, you're not just going home, you're being sent into the world as a witness.

Brothers and sisters, we have a mission to live boldly for Christ. And that mission begins and ends with the Eucharist. Let us never forget: the One who gave His life on the Cross now gives His life to us in every Mass. This week, as you go about your routine; whether it's at work, school, the barbershop, the doctor's office, or at the kitchen table, remember: you carry Jesus with you. Let that reality shape your words. Let it guide your decisions. Let it fuel your hope.

And may every step you take reflect the One who walks beside you, the One you received in love, and who now lives in you.

"Do this in remembrance of me." Not just once a weekbut every day, in how we live.


