Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Today we are observing ten, ostracized lepers, disheartened men who were hopeless. They had leprosy, a disease for which there was no cure. In fact, leprosy was a death sentence carried out a little bit at a time—an arm now, a leg or ear later. Because the disease was thought to be highly contagious, lepers were driven out of town where they could not associate with anybody. These men were hopeless, helpless, and alone, but they formed a friendship among themselves.

One day they heard about Jesus, and their hopes began to rise. They had reached the point of believing, so they began to dream that they could be made whole again. Despite a hopeless disease, they began to feel there was a chance to live. Through fellowship, these ten lepers had the courage to keep going. They went to seek out Jesus and yelled out to him, "Master, have mercy upon us." Everybody would have told them they were going to die, that it was useless to ask for help. If they had believed that they would have died. But they came to our Lord, taking Jesus at his word that "All things are possible to them who believe."

Jesus saw a way to test their faith. He said to them, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." They could have looked at each other and said, "Well, nothing's happened to us. We're just the same as we were." Instead, they did what he said; they obeyed him. As they went, the blessing came and they were cleansed. What a wonderful experience! However, the text tells us there were ten lepers. They all asked Jesus for healing, and they were all healed. But there was a key difference in one of them. Nine of them received healing and went on their way. Only one took the trouble to come back and say, "thank you."

One could almost feel the Lord's disappointment and sadness in his voice when he asked, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the other nine?" Why didn't the nine come back? I imagine one reason is because of their selfish pride. Perhaps they thought, A lot of people have leprosy, and it takes their lives. But we had the power to overcome it. I have a feeling they went around saying, "Look what I've done, I've been healed." To have returned to thank Jesus would have deflated their egos. That is an ordinary problem with humanity. The reason a lot of people do not experience gratefulness is because of our egos. Instead of giving thanks, we say, "Look at how great I am. "I have also heard people

say to me how they struggle to say thank you, "I'm thankful, but I'm not the kind to say so." Or maybe they were so excited. They probably had families they had not seen in a while. Maybe they had business they needed to attend to. Maybe they intended to thank Jesus later; we know that one well. Or maybe those nine people were not thankful because they concentrated on their self-interest instead of their blessings.

Were there not ten healed? Where are the nine?" Suppose the Lord looked down on all the people in the world. Would he look at us and say: Look at this person, this family, or this business. I poured out my blessings upon them, but they do not have time to thank me. They do not ever remember the things I have done.

The Gospel although highlights the one leper who was a foreigner and enemy of the Jews. Yet he alone expressed gratitude for God's healing. Through his newfound faith he was able to return and acknowledge the giver of grace. As we learned last weekend, true faith leads us to action, and we do not need a lot of it. "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to the mulberry tree, be uprooted and planted in the sea, it would obey you." The Samaritan returning was that tangible expression of his faith that we talked about in the sermon. Faithful gratitude is always a way of being saved.

I believe the act of coming to church, participation in the Sacraments, being good disciples and Christians, is a gesture of thankfulness similar to the one man returning to see the Lord. You could have done something else this morning, but you came to Mass to say, "thank you Jesus." The leper received a physical blessing the first time, but when he came back the second time, he received an even greater blessing. Jesus said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." (your faith has saved you!) The Samaritan had received a spiritual blessing that could not replace his physical blessing. We only have to look around at the people we know and ask ourselves, do their physical blessings make them happy? Most of the time, the answer is no. When they receive the physical blessing they desire, they fail to give thanks and, as a result, do not receive a spiritual blessing from their Lord and Savior.
