

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT(C)

"When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from Him [Jesus] for a time." Luke 4:13

Powerful lessons learned; when Jesus was tempted

If the devil was **bold enough to tempt Jesus**, the Son of God (Luke 4:1-13); he doesn't give a second thought about tempting us. As followers of Christ, we will **encounter** temptations. Jesus teaches us **important lessons**, as He is being tempted by the devil.

The devil is real. He is not a figment of your imagination. Jesus was not talking to thin air but to a being. I am amazed at the amount of Christians who do not believe that the devil exists. Jesus held a conversation and responded to the devil; He was teaching us that the devil is real. In the book On Heaven and Earth, Pope Francis said, "I believe that the devil exists" and "his greatest achievement in these times has been to make us believe he doesn't exist." In a morning homily on Oct. 30, 2014, Pope Francis said that the Christian life is a constant battle against the devil. "The devil is not tossing flowers at us, but flaming arrows" aimed to kill the Pope said. If we don't believe that the devil exists; we have already lost the battle against him.

Expect to be attacked. As followers of Christ, we are not exempt from temptation and the attacks of the devil. We are warned to be "vigilant" (be on careful watch) for the "devil" who "is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour" 1 Peter 5:8. After the third temptation; the devil **temporarily left** Jesus for a more opportune and favorable time (Luke 4:13). Jesus had to be alert for other attacks from the devil. Therefore, we shouldn't be caught by surprise, when we are tempted. Someone may be unkind and hateful, and you may be tempted to hold a grudge or try to get revenge. There is a warning in the sport of Boxing: Never drop your guard! Learn how to recognize the devil. The devil will not come to you with a pitchfork and horns. We can't go on how he looks, because he "masquerades as an

come to you with a **pitchfork and horns.** We can't go on how he looks, because he "masquerades as an angel of light" (2 Cor. 11:14), so he can deceive people. **Men**, the devil may come to you wearing pumps, a short dress, and a body measurement of 36-24-36. **Ladies**, the devil may come to you with big biceps and a smooth conversation. Jesus teaches us how to recognize

the devil: anybody who tries to get you to go against the Scriptures, is the devil. It could be your closest friend, a co-worker, or a neighbor. The devil wanted Jesus to worship him (Luke 4:6-7) which was contrary to the Scriptures.

Jesus told the devil, "It is written: you shall worship the Lord, your God, and Him alone shall you serve." Christians **shouldn't** place anyone **before** God. Believers need the Armor of God as St. Paul called it in Ephesians 6.

Below is an illustration of two Christians; one is **not prepared** to meet the demonic and wicked challenges of the world, and the other is

ready. The water in the pitcher represents

the cares, deceitfulness, and lust of the world Jesus warned about in Mark 4:19. The peeled **orange** represents the Christian that is deceived by the devil, rarely prays, doesn't



forgive, chases material things, and God is **not** first in their life. When placed in the water, the peeled orange sinks to the bottom; which signifies a Christian overcome and defeated by the world. The unpeeled orange is the Christian covered with the Armor of God. They love Christ and their neighbor; they pray and read the Scriptures daily, they may have some Bible verses memorized, and they are in a continuous pursuit to be righteous. They can stay afloat against the tactics of the devil (Eph. 6:11). Believers must diligently work to keep the devil from having an opportunity or advantage in their lives and not let the situations of this world **drown them.** Even if I push the unpeeled orange down in the water, it will rise back to the top! "The just fall seven times, [but] they rise again" (Prov. 24:16).


