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Dear RPLA Friends,

As we reflect on this past year, I am incredibly proud of what we have achieved together. For the first time, we saw results presented from research we *helped fund* (see page 6)! This is an incredible milestone and an experience we will continue to enjoy as our grant program continues. We also launched a YouTube channel to share information from healthcare experts and started a blog to share stories from the RPL community. All this, while continuing to support and advocate for improved care for loss families.

On the organizational front, we welcomed a new Board member, Hannah Palac, who has been instrumental in helping find a new home for our RPL Community Registry (see pages 8-9). We also had our first in-person Board retreat, courtesy of Chris and Carolyn Eigel, who generously opened their lake house to us for a weekend of strategic planning. Lastly, you'll notice that my signature block has changed. Joey Konefal has taken over responsibilities as President of the Board while I am operating as Executive Director. This delineation of responsibilities is an important step as we continue to grow the organization and position ourselves to hire staff.

Looking to 2025, there are some exciting things on the horizon. Dr. Micaela Stevenson Wyszewianski has joined our Board. She is a resident physician in Obstetrics and Gynecology intending to pursue a fellowship in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility. In addition to medical expertise, she has experience in political and community organizing for increased access to reproductive healthcare for patients. Dr. Ron Libbrizi and I will have several opportunities to address physicians to discuss the importance of miscarriage tissue testing (see page 8). We intend to host an inaugural awareness and fundraising run this summer. And we will work to reestablish our Community Registry on the IAMRARE platform hosted by NORD.


Mission


Research Findings Presented

One of the most exciting moments of the year was hearing Dr. Workalemahu present his findings at the ASRM Congress. Dr. Workalemahu was RPLA's first grant recipient in 2022. His project was aimed at finding inherited genes related to unexplained pregnancy loss.

His team identified several genomic regions in the placenta that may contribute to stillbirth. They also identified genomic regions implicated in *in utero* development, pregnancy loss, and infertility.

Further investigation is needed to understand the functional roles of the identified genes and how they contribute to stillbirth, pregnancy loss, and infertility. This deeper understanding could guide the development of diagnostic tools and personalized risk assessments for couples with a family history of pregnancy complications or loss.





2024 Grant Recipient

The 2024 research award was given to Abey Eapen, MBBS, DRCOG, PhD, FCRI for his project exploring autoimmune, inflammatory, and epigenetic disruptors associated with unexplained recurrent pregnancy loss.

Dr. Eapen is a Clinical Associate Professor in the Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility division of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Iowa.

Reproductive immunology is a hotly debated area. A major hurdle is the lack of laboratory tests that can diagnose potential contributing conditions with good confidence. However, Dr. Eapen believes that there are some simple tests that, when combined with the standard RPL workup and patient history, can help provide more information about the causes of unexplained pregnancy loss.



Stories of Loss and Hope

In April we launched a blog on our website title "Stories of Loss and Hope" to share stories from the community. Each story we've had the honor to share is a unique gift, and we hope by continuing to build out this resource we will weave a shared narrative that honors our pain, celebrates our strength, and reminds us that we are not alone.



Front Page News

RPLA got some media attention this year when former Board member, Amy Henderson Riley, made the front page of USA Today's weekend edition in an article about the mixed emotions of Mother's Day for members of the infertility community. These types of stories are crucial to help destigmatize infertility and pregnancy loss.

RPLA was also featured in a special report from STAT News in August which highlighted the knowledge gap about miscarriage in the US.



Ask the Expert Video Series

RPLA continues to build out its library of resources. This year we launched a YouTube channel to more easily share our "Ask the Expert" series which features interviews with doctors and other healthcare providers on topics related to recurrent pregnancy loss and infertility. Advocating for Improved Care

Board members, Dr. Ron Librizzi and Megan Hanson, presented at the American College of Osteopathic Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOOG) mid-year meeting. They spoke about the importance of fetal autopsy and miscarriage tissue testing, and how information from both should influence the diagnostic and care pathway for families who have experienced pregnancy loss. Megan shared her personal journey and Dr. Librizzi discussed compassionate care for RPL families and how to push for answers.

Peer-to-Peer Support

RPLA continues to host a free, monthly peer-to-peer support group for the RPL community. The group takes place virtually, so that folks can join from any city or time zone. We consider it a responsibility and a privilege to hold this space. Sometimes the support group is the first place people have talked about their losses publicly. Often it is first time people meet others who've experienced multiple losses. These connections help validate and normalize an experience which otherwise can feel quite isolating.



RPL Community Registry

We were shocked, saddened, and disappointed last January to learn that the LunaDNA platform, which we used to host the RPL Community Registry, was closing.

A registry is a critical tool to enable research. A lot of effort went into selecting Luna and creating our Community on the platform. We know our members also spent a great deal of time and emotional effort answering the surveys and sharing their data with us. Board member, Hannah Palac, spent the better part of 2024 evaluating new platforms. We are excited to share that we will re-launch our registry on IAMRARE, a platform powered by NORD, the National Organization of Rare Diseases. Work to relaunch will take place throughout 2025.



COMMUNITY REGISTRY OVERVIEW



Demographics




Pregnancies and Parental Status

Comments

In 2024 RPLA received \$81,756 in unrestricted gifts from 188 donors. This represents an 8.9% increase in contributions from FY23. Total income was \$81,848.

Expenses were \$78,905 which represents a 30% increase from FY23.

- Program expenses were \$46,365. This was 15% lower than FY23 due to the LunaDNA closure (decreased registry expenses). We also funded a one-time scientific symposium at the ASRM conference in FY23.
- General & administrative expenses increased three-fold. This increase resulted from outsourced bookkeeping service which began this year, and increased government filing fees.
- Fundraising & development expenses also increased in FY24. This was driven by \$19,300 in services paid to a professional grant writer which will be discontinued in FY25.

Net gain for the year was \$2,943. Total assets as of December 31, 2024 were \$124,615. There were no liabilities.

Forward Looking Statement

We anticipate FY25 individual contributions to be comparable to FY24. We intend to host a virtual awareness building and fundraising run in 2025 which will help increase our revenue. With the intended relaunch of the RPL Community Registry on the IAMRARE platform, we expect program expenses to increase. This will be offset by a decrease in fundraising expenses (see above). We expect to end the year net positive with a strong cash position.

We continue to build our cash reserve to (1) ensure that we are always able to pay out the grant award in Q2, and (2) put us in a position to eventually hire full-time staff.
