First Christian Church artifacts now housed at Heritage Farm

After 184 years in Brunswick, First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has closed its doors. Thanks to the remaining members who called on former pastor, the Rev. Dr. John Mills, to help distribute the collection and furnishings of the church.

The Historical Society now has all the records kept over these years along with a treasure trove of photographs, bibles and ledgers. We will find a permanent home for them once the Society's new building is ready next year.

Meanwhile, they are in safe places throughout the buildings.

Two beautiful chairs and a small table are already up in the parlor, complete with an 1874 bible atop the table. A portrait of Ellen Gibbs (a founding member of the Brunswick Area Historical Society) and a banner from the church are also now on display.

We still have to get the bell from the bell tower before demolition. We will have to have equipment to move it and workers to attach the bell to move it. President Carl Bilski and Vice President Dave Goodyear are working to find us the people and equipment to get it to the farm. We probably will put it

in the carriage house for now – alongside the school bell from one room schoolhouse No. 7.

The bell was donated by the Gibbs family and there is a stone at the bottom of the tower with that information. We hope to save that as well.





Old School Trivia night was successful

The first organized fundraiser for our new building was held Sept. 21 and thanks to the wonderful volunteers who did so much prep work, it was a great success. The event raised nearly \$4,000 for our building fund, which is the "Old School" – pieces of Edwards Middle School we hope to re-create at Heritage Farm.

Members of the team will receive Tshirts courtesy of Key Profits and a brick paver with their team name to be placed at the new building.
