	In the year the charity generated an overall surplus of receipts less payments of £23,476 (there was a surplus on Restricted Funds of £73,717 and a deficit on Unrestricted Funds of \pounds 50,241).
Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	 Both receipts and payments were reduced by the impact of Covid restrictions: no face-to-face training with its clients, limited merchandise sales, no fundraising events.
	The charity made limited use of the Covid-19 furlough scheme, a total of £11,689 received and is disclosed as government grants.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	The charity aims to hold a minimum six months of operating costs plus property lease expenditure for the unexpired portion of the office lease, as free reserves to provide stability and as a precaution against an unexpected decline in income.
	The level of free reserves at the end of the financial year stood at $\pounds79,158$, being $\pounds25,424$ cash and $\pounds53,734$ Charifund investment (2020: $\pounds111,790$).
Amount of reserves held	 The balance of Restricted Funds is greater than normal because: Covid-19 restrictions curtailed some activities, and Funding for planned expenditure in 2021/22 was received before the financial year end.
