 Huntington and Margaret Huntington 1790th of Newark  
 in the County of West and State of New Jersey and in  
 Consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars to us in  
 hand paid by Mary Swalley of the same town County and  
 State aforesaid the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge  
 have remise and released and forever quit claimed and do by  
 these presents remise and forever quit claim unto the said  
 Mary Swalley her heirs and Assigns forever or certain  
 lot of land lying in Newark bounded as follows to wit  
 Westwardly on Lawrence's river Eastwardly on land of Christopher  
 St. Rice Southwardly on Mary Swalley's water by on the County  
 and Governor Humphreys Road and also situate on  
 the same lot wherein are the above lot being situate  
 one one the Plat aforesaid being had to the Plat of  
 Division of the Estate of Peter Swalley late of Newark  
 Deceased,

to have and to hold the same together with all the  
 privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging to her  
 the said Mary Swalley her heirs and assigns forever  
 In witness whereof we hereunto set our hands and  
 Affixed our Seal this
