has moved down her husband's father in Liding  
Warrington to live with him fifteen miles  
from me I went down and stayed with her  
two weeks in July and found her very comfort<sup>able</sup>  
she has had three children but has but two living  
the last her youngest two years ago I expect she  
will have another before long whether I want you  
to write and let me know something how you  
are let your circumstances be what they may  
I you could come so far as hear and let me see  
your face once more it <sup>would</sup> be very pleasing  
your sister Lucy's children have all got good  
homes I think I <sup>never</sup> knew so many children left  
with out a mother and some with out a father  
with out a father too for he had nothing to do with  
and was very unwell based

since he is more healthy and is being very  
well for out I have heard  
I makit home at Brothers Sams. but ~~not~~ visit  
my sisters and Brothers two and three and four  
usually at a time just as I feel I need respect  
Return to my Children to the westward again  
I not think is likely that I could stand the  
journey if you should fail of coming to see me  
this fall or winter it is not very likely that  
I shall ever see man more of my Children  
I bid them farewell last fall when I left  
them I want you too let me no whether whether  
your uncle wotterman is living or not this from  
your aged mother in her eighty third year
