embrace it as (judging by my own feelings) I

more from your poor despicable old Mother
I say once more because the state of
my health is such that in all human
probability I shall not continue much
longer in ~~this~~ world of care and trouble
It is now 14 Months since I walked as
that and I never expect to walk again
I know many other opinions this attending
as so that I can say that I am near
free of pain and I have no expectation
of ever being any better I wish you a
letter which was not now giving me an
account of your Father's Death it is some
of satisfaction to us all that he died
convinced to the will of his Maker
and that we may all be prepared for
that awful visit is the sincere Prayer of your
affectionate Mother. On the 10th
of Dec. I live with Brother David and have
very things promised to make me comfortable
I wish that you would see all well the last
I heard from them which was not long since
when you have read the vessel often and
if to your Well Wishes I should be glad
to hear from you whenever you have a chance to
