

This indenture of Partition made by Robert Thomas yeildy
of Mareshead in the County of York Thawmer of the one part and
and Andrew Lee of Mareshead apud Githernem & Elizabeth his
wife of the other part witnesseth that the said Thomas Elizabeth
are now laies & papists of and in two parts of Land with the
Oreard and home head of maner called the Oreard by Robert
his Neighbour Thawmer standing and the third part of
Andrew's Lott called land out of their one then all situate
in Mareshead aforesaid And the said Parties have agreed on
and made the Partition of the same in equal portions to
among them to hold the same severally in manner and
form following viz The said Thomas his heirs shall have the
first being all the best by end of the Champion Houes
The divided by a Tree & river thro' the middle of the back of
the Linnings & continued both ways thro' the Houes from top to
Bottom these of with the West end under the same and a piece of land
abovemy bounded Southwale, on a lane or highway way fourteen
feet wide which is hereby signed by both parties to be left forever
in common to each of them viz (four fowen) Easterly on a piece of
land bounded wth Houes of ynd to Elizabeth westward thirty five stinks
to a stake standing in two feet westward of an Apple tree. Southwale
on the said piece of land and to extend from the stake to the Houes
lane & measure fifty stinks to an Oak tree by the wall bar to the
one brooked lane & extends to Rigot's Land, Northwale on Rigot's Land
two fowen & ten stinks to a Stake & head of Stones Westwale
on the other half of the Oreard & extends to a Stake at the upper
end of the lane or highway way as also the westerly half of
the Oreard on Garden to be as there is seen way bounded North
