FUNERAL AT PHENIX
The funeral of Mrs. Matilda M. Spencer, widow of Harvey L. Spencer, was held this afternoon at 1 o'clock from the home, Fairview avenue, Phenix. Many relatives and friends attended the service which was conducted by Rev. Charles A. Meader, pastor of the Church of the Ascension, Auburn, and a former rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Harris. Miss Ruth Johnson sang. Burial was at the LeValley Cemetery on Card street, where eight generations of the family are interred. The bearers were Clarence H. Spencer, Lucien Himes, Lee Spencer and Edward D. Potter.

MRS. SPENCER DEAD
Mrs. Matilda M. (Le Valley) Spencer, widow of Harvey L. Spencer, died last evening at 6:30 at her home, Fairview avenue, Phenix, in her 78th year. She is survived by a son, Clarence H. Spencer; five grandchildren, Lee and Donald Spencer, Lucien Himes, Mrs. Lucille Huxley and Miss Elizabeth Himes and by a step-daughter, Miss Etta Spencer of Pomfret Centre. The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 1 o'clock from the home. Burial will be in the Le Valley family cemetery on Card street and will be private.
Mrs. Spencer was the last of the Le Valley family. She was born in Phenix in 1846 and was a daughter of John Le Valley. She was a direct lineal descendant of Michael Le Valley, whose family together with those of 44 other French Huguenots came to America in 1700 and settled in Frenchtown. She was also a direct lineal descendant of Peter Le Valley, founder of the south section of Phenix, who built, more than 200 years ago, the house near the crest of Fairview avenue and which had been occu-

pled by seven generations of the family prior to Mrs. Spencer's occupancy.
