


CONJECTURES

The Cosmic Sweep

If what I suggested in last month’s article is true, namely that God in Christ is not separate from us, but rather present in all things, all around us, all the time, then it seems to me that God intends to save all people, all things, indeed the entire creation. How could God not do so? God created everything and declared from the beginning that it was “good, good, good, good, good,..very good!”

In the letter to the congregation in Ephesus, we read:

God has taken pleasure in revealing the mystery of the plan through Christ, to be carried out in the fullness of time; namely, to bring all things — in heaven and on earth — together in Christ.

The Franciscan author, Richard Rohr says it this way:

The good news of the Gospel is that God is saving and redeeming the Whole first and foremost, and we are all caught up in this Cosmic Sweep of Divine Love.


The God of Love made the Whole and will not stop until God has saved everything entirely.

But, what is involved in this saving and redeeming the Whole? Remember, that word so often translated as “saved” can also be translated as “healed”. So, think of it this way, God’s salvation comes in the form of mending and healing everything. Every last person, animal, plant, planet, healed and made whole.

God is at this moment working to bring healing, reconciliation, unity, wholeness to the whole of the cosmos. And, that is good news. It is good news because God is the one initiating it and God is the one who will bring it to completion. We are free then to simply trust God’s intention and allow ourselves to get caught up in the *cosmic sweep of divine love*, joining God in this work to heal all people and the creation in Christ.

“From beginning to end Christ is there, towering far above everything, everyone. So spacious is Christ, so roomy, that everything of God finds its proper place in Christ without crowding. Not only that, but all the broken and dislocated pieces of the universe— people and things, animals and atoms— get properly fixed and fit together in vibrant harmonies,”



Prayer & Practices:

Entering the Story

Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits, popularized this form of prayer in which you imagine yourself in a scene from scripture. It is a way of letting God speak to you through your imagination.

First, choose a narrative passage from scripture, one that you enjoy. Then,...

Read the text slowly and carefully; recall what it is about; then let it come alive for you!

Place yourself inside the story, using your imagination; become one of the characters in the scene.

Participate in the dynamics of the scene, dialoguing & interacting with Jesus and other characters.

Observe what is going on around you in the scene: What do you see, hear, feel, smell, taste, touch?

Dialogue with the other characters: What do they say or ask you? What do you say or ask them in reply?

Notice what is going on inside you as you pray: joy, sorrow, peace, confusion, love, anger, etc.

Pray: enter into a short personal conversation with God; speak heart-to-heart, as if conversing with a close friend.

assists flooding victims in the United States

Lutheran Disaster Response brings God's hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, we stay to provide ongoing assistance to those in need.

U.S. Flooding

Periods of heavy rainfall in southeastern Texas have resulted in widespread flooding and that some residents in and around Houston report to be worse than what they remember during Hurricane Harvey in 2017. Neighborhoods, roads and farms are completely submerged.

Cleanup continues in Nebraska, Iowa, Wisconsin, Missouri, and other states affected by spring floods and severe storms over the summer months, where historic flood levels were recorded at 42 locations.

Our response:

Lutheran Disaster Response is responding to these emergencies through congregations, synods and our affiliates across Texas, Nebraska, Iowa, Wisconsin and Missouri.

What you can do:

Gifts to "U.S. flooding" will be used in full (100 percent) to assist those affected by flooding until the response is complete.

Rev. Kevin Strickland
to be installed as Bishop of the ELCA-Southeastern Synod on October 5



The service of Holy Communion with the Rite of Installation of The Reverend Kevin Lyle Strickland as Bishop of the Southeastern Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will occur at 2pm EDT on Saturday, October 5th at the Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta, GA. All are welcome!

Prior to being elected Bishop of the Southeastern Synod on June 2, 2019, Bishop Strickland served as the Assistant to the ELCA Presiding Bishop — Executive for Worship of the ELCA. His service with the ELCA churchwide staff in Chicago began in August 2014.

Born and raised in Lexington, SC, Bishop Strickland is an honors graduate of Newberry College (Newberry, SC) with a Bachelor of Arts in Religion and Philosophy and a minor in History. He also received a Master of Divinity from Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary (Columbia, SC).

Following his ordination Bishop Strickland served as pastor of St. Paul (Maryville, TN) and Holy Trinity (Nashville, TN). Previously Bishop Strickland served in the area of youth and family ministry with Incarnation (Columbia, SC), St. Philip's (Newberry, SC), Church of the Redeemer (Newberry, SC), & Mt. Tabor (W. Columbia, SC).

Bishop Strickland has served on various local non-profit boards and has a heart for justice and advocacy ministry.

Bishop Strickland and his spouse, Robby are excited about what God has in store for the Southeastern Synod of the ELCA and look forward to walking this journey together.
