

Cleric with us. But, what if God in Christ is not separate at all, but rather present in all things, all around us, all the time? Such a thought is radical, I know. It is radical in the true sense of that word, radical (from the Latin radix, radic-'root') meaning "an inherent or fundamental part of the nature of someone or something".

Martin Luther believed that it is the radical nature of God to be in all, not relegated to certain places and times. We hear this, Luther's view in his writings about the sacraments, when as he argued with another theologian, the Swiss Reformer, Ulrich Zwingli, Luther made the quirky comment that he knew Christ was in the bread at Holy Communion because Christ was present in his cabbage soup. Yes, Luther believed that Christ is present in the sacraments (baptism and communion) because Christ is present in all creation. As St. Paul wrote "Christ is all things and in all people" (Col. 3:11, CEB).

If we can conclude, with Luther and St. Paul, that the entire physical world around us, all of creation, is both the hiding place and the revelation place for God, then we can open ourselves to begin seeing Christ in neighbor and stranger, friend and foe, creation and civilization. And that way of seeing changes everything. Suddenly how we treat the creation, the illegal immigrant, our family member, the homeless neighbor, each person we encounter through the day, is a direct expression of our conduct toward Christ. When we mistreat the creation, we mistreat Christ. When we denigrate the humanity of another, we denigrate Christ. But, when we act compassionately toward our neighbor in need or care compassionately for the creation, then it is a direct expression of our love for Christ.

ELCA Churchwide Assembly Actions

Gathering under the theme "We are church," voting members of the 2019 Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) made a number of key decisions to further the mission and ministry of this church. The assembly, the chief legislative authority of the church, met Aug. 5-10 at the Wisconsin Center in Milwaukee.

More than 900 voting members:

- · Reelected on the first ballot the Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton to a six-year term as ELCA presiding bishop.
- · Elected Deacon Sue Rothmeyer to a six-year term as ELCA secretary. Rothmeyer is currently serving as executive for administration with the Office of the Secretary.
- Approved the social statement "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Call to Action" and its implementing resolutions. The social statement, in part, names patriarchy and sexism as sins and calls the church to action on a range of issues, including genderbased violence, workplace discrimination and economic inequality.
- Adopted "A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment," which will serve as church policy for interreligious relations. The policy statement was adopted with the witness of 39 ecumenical and interreligious guests in attendance.

Prayer & Practices:

Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is simply sitting in silence, open to God's love and your love for God. This prayer is beyond thoughts, emotions, or sensations. Like being with a very close friend or lover, where words are not required.

Because our minds are so attached to thinking, sometimes choosing a sacred word as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within. [Then,] sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly, and silently introduce your sacred word. . . . When you become aware of thoughts, return ever-so-gently to your sacred word. At the end of the prayer period, remain in silence for a couple of minutes.

Begin with five or ten minutes building over time to 20-30 minutes each day. Let go of all expectations or goals during this time. It is not about achieving anything, whether emptying your mind or finding peace or achieving a spiritual experience. There is no way to succeed at Centering Prayer, except to return again and again to Love.


Senior High Bible Study Wednesday evenings at 5:30pm starting September 4.

ELCA Churchwide Assembly Actions

(continued)

- •Adopted the "Strategy Toward Authentic Diversity in the ELCA," which consists of a report and recommendations on how the ELCA exhibits authentic diversity and formulates goals for racial diversity and inclusion.
- •Adopted a memorial that calls for the development of a social statement and social message on the relationship of church and state.
- •Witnessed the presentation of the "Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent," which was accepted by the Rev. Lamont A. Wells, president of the African Descent Lutheran Association (ADLA), and members of ADLA.
- •Adopted a memorial that affirms the ELCA's long-standing commitment to migrants and refugees and declares the ELCA a sanctuary church body.
- •Adopted a memorial to encourage all synods and congregations to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the ELCA's ordination of women in 2020, the 40th anniversary of the ordination of women of color in the Lutheran tradition and the 10th anniversary of the ELCA's decision to remove barriers to ordination for people in same-gender relationships.
- •Adopted a memorial to support the vision and goals of the Poor People's Campaign that align with the ELCA's social teachings.
- •Adopted a series of amendments to the "Constitutions, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America," including one that makes ordination the entrance rite for ministers of Word and Service (Deacons).
- •Adopted a resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance in the ELCA for the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9— the nine people who were shot and killed June 17, 2015, during a Bible study at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C.
- Adopted a resolution to condemn white supremacy, calling all ELCA congregations to engage in a "study of the structures and rhetoric that empower and fuel racism and white supremacy and to take to heart the teaching of Scriptures, so we may all be better equipped to speak boldly about the equal dignity of all persons in the eyes of God."
