MORE ABOUT LITTLE LEARNERS: TN EARLY CHILDHOOD CLASSES

Welcome, Little Learners!

At True North, we know the early childhood years are an incredibly important time for laying a foundation of lifelong learning. It is a time when play dominates the learning process, and natural curiosity and exploration are the best teachers. We know that children are born learners, eager to explore their environments, and that play is actually very important work!

This year at True North, we wanted to focus on making a dedicated space for our littlest learners to play, a space that would further ignite their curiosity, and a space that would help activate their own natural desire to learn. That's why we have created 'Little Learners'; a new class structure for our littlest learners at True North.

'Little Learners' will encompass our Early Childhood Classes at True North; serving our 3s Class, 4s Class, and 5s Class. We will have a dedicated, individual classroom for each age group—their "Homeroom"—that will be overseen by their Lead Teacher, and their Assistant Teachers. But, during the entirety of our Wednesday class time, each age group will also have Activity Rotation Time where they will rotate through 3 additional classrooms and unique learning environments: 'Learning Lab', 'Tinker Town', and 'Move & Groove'.

Your child will begin their day in their Homeroom, then after a 'Welcome Circle', they will begin their Activity Rotation Time, traveling with their Assistant Teachers to 'Learning Lab', 'Tinker Town', and 'Move & Groove. *Their Lead Teacher will hang back in their Homeroom, to welcome the other rotating age groups and to facilitate their assigned Activity Rotation. During Activity Rotation Time, your child will spend approximately 30min in each class (45min with transition times built-in) engaged in age-appropriate, hands-on activities, that are play-based and FUN! Then, they will rotate back to their Homeroom for a 'Snack and Storytime' and to complete their final rotation activity. Each day will end with a 'Wrap-Up Circle' in their Homeroom, before Parent Pick-Up.

Learning Lab: Dive into Early Learning fun in the Learning Lab! In our Indoor Classroom, we will have hands-on activities that highlight foundational early learning skills like Fine Motor and Gross Motor Development, Alphabet Recognition, and Early Math. We will also have plenty of space for Imaginative Play AND will get to explore Sensory Activities of all sorts in our Outdoor Classroom.

Tinker Town: Calling all Tinker Tots! Join us in Tinker Town for loads of building and creating fun! In each class, we will be using our hands and our heads to think up new creations and explore early learning concepts through tinkering. With a variety of building materials and even some REAL tools, we will have a blast building whatever our brains can imagine. You are in charge of your own discoveries in Tinker Town, and we can't wait to learn alongside you!

Move & Groove: Time to get your groove on!! In Move & Groove class we will be strengthening our Fine Motor and Gross Motor Skills, as well as our Early Literacy & Language Skills while having TONS of fun! We will sing songs, learn new dances, and get our bodies moving in all sorts of fun and silly ways. We will also be strengthening our Listening Skills, but we'll be having so much fun we won't even realize we are learning that part. Best of all, we will get to laugh and dance with our friends, helping build relationships with our peers. Now, let's bust a move!

Overview

Ages: 6+ We welcome a variety of ages! **Students must be able to read. Please keep in mind, this production is a Junior which means there are longer and more lines per some characters, extended songs, more solo opportunities and the show itself is 1 hour instead of 30 minutes. When you sign up, keep in mind your child's stamina/ability for a longer production. They do NOT need to be a character in order to participate. If they prefer to be in the ensemble, there are SO MANY wonderful songs for them to sing and dance in. Auditions will be held the first day of coop after classes and lunch.

Class Cost: \$135 per semester. Breakdown Cost Per Week: \$11.25

*Price includes costumes, T-shirt, script, set, props, projections, theater rental, programs, copyright/licensing, videography, etc. *For any of our drama families with more than one drama student, financial need-based scholarships are available. Class Description:

Students will rehearse Alice in Wonderland Jr. for one year (TWO semesters) and will have two performances (approximately 3pm and 6pm) tentatively on either April 18 or April 25, 2026. A dress rehearsal will be scheduled for either April 17 or the 24, 2026. Location will hopefully be Hamilton Heights High School and tickets will be \$5 general admission per person per show. **Performance date may be subject to change based on theater availability.**

Class Objectives:

While the students are learning the production, we will be taking our time focusing on: varying Acting Techniques, Musicality, Choreography, Projection, Body Language, Acting vs. Reacting, Teamwork, Theater Principles, and MORE all while having whole lotta fun building our show!!

Commitment Requirements

- 1. This is a one-year long class. You must be willing to commit to being in drama Fall AND Spring semesters.
- 2. Students should be willing to audition. However, any student who doesn't wish to audition is still welcome to join us and will be part of our ensemble! Auditions will be held the first week of co-op after classes and lunch. Auditions will start around 1:15 pm in 5 minute slots.
- 3. Each student will be responsible for practicing and memorizing their lines, songs, and choreography at home. The lines needed each week are REQUIRED to be memorized BEFORE each class period. This is a slight change due to the show being a Junior production. We will have a detailed schedule of weekly plans so you will know where in the script we are at.
- 4. Families must be willing to stay after co-op for extra rehearsals occasionally. We try to keep this to a minimum.
- 5. Families MUST attend dress rehearsal the day before the performance and be available for most of the day on performance day. (Tentative show date will be either April 18 or 25, with dress rehearsal either April 17 or 24, 2026.)
- 6. Costumes WILL BE provided for this production. Students will be expected to provide their own undergarments or base costuming (ie: leggings, long sleeve shirts etc.) as well as stage shoes (black jazz/dance/flat shoes or character shoes).
- 7. Parents must be willing to volunteer during performance weekend. (ex. set up/tear down, stage mom in the wings, costumes, ticketing, fundraising, dinner prep, spotlights, etc)
