VMN State Conference

The Virginia Master Naturalist State Conference was held virtually October 1-3. The conference included networking sessions, pre-recorded sessions on multiple topics with live Q&A sessions, as well as live sessions on topics such as the Opening Plenary: Nature's Puzzle with Alonso Abugattas (Capital Naturalist), Accessing Nature, Reducing Plastic Pollution and Solid Waste, Wilderness in Virginia, Night Should be Dark, Building Bridges to the Natural World, and many others. Those who were registered for the conference have access to recordings for six months. Recordings are now available in the Whova app.

Many chapter members took advantage of both virtual and in-person activities held locally and even used in-person events to discuss the virtual sessions. Local in-person events included two sessions for Discovering Nature in Your Favorite Place – Lake Anna Bird Walk with Donna Finne-

gan and Belmont Nature Walk with Imogene Treble and John Wiltenmuth – and a trash cleanup at Old Mill Park for the Day of Service. We had several members of the current basic training class come out and join in the activities.



Useful Apps for Master Naturalists

There are many useful apps for the Master Naturalist in the field that are free. There are several apps available for identification of plants and wildlife including Seek, iNaturalist, and PlantSnap. Seek is great for playing around alone and learning while iNaturalist is more like social media for the Nature Nerd. For the native plant enthusiast Flora of Virginia is available as an app for \$20.

There are several apps for birding including eBird, BirdNET, Merlin, and Raptor ID. There are many others including some that cost like The Warbler Guide. A few of the apps have added sound identification. Merlin Bird ID has been my favorite for sound identification because it reinforces the bird that is singing each time it is heard.

There are also apps with trail information and maps including All Trails and Avenza. The Virginia State Parks have put free maps out for Avenza this year. The Avenza app is great for remote areas with no cell signal as it still shows your location on the trail map. It has helped me out several times when I've been exploring new locations.
