On a warm summer's night, on the 15th floor of an office tower in the heart of Willowdale, Shelley Klinck is discussing the ins and outs of condoms. Over the airwayes, no less.

Why it's important to use them, what to look for when buying them, how to use them, how to practise using them, how the flavored ones taste.

"Yum (it's chocolate parfait), delicious!" says Klinck's studio guest Barbara Lamb, a health educator with the Birth Control and VD Information Centre in North York.

"Wow, lemon. We're happy!" exclaims Klinck.
