Frank talk about everything from condom-shopping to alcoholism keeps the airwaves humming on AM 640 radio's popular late-night call-in show for teenagers

On a warm summer's night, on the 15th floor of an office tower in the heart of Willowdale, Shelley Klinck is discussing the ins and outs of condoms. Over the airwaves, no less.

Why it's important to use them, what to look for when buying them, how to use them, how to practise using them, how the flavored ones taste.

"Yum (it's chocolate parfait), delicious!" says Klinck's studio guest Barbara Lamb, a health educator with the Birth Control and VD Information Centre in North York.

"Wow, lemon. We're happy!" exclaims Klinck.

She's head producer and host of *Sex, Lives And Audiotape*, a Sunday through Thursday, 11 p.m. to midnight, call-in teen talk show.

AM 640 radio launched the program last August after Klinck, who had no previous radio experience, sold them on the idea.

The show now has the ear of an estimated 8,200 teens each quarter hour. A dozen or more youngsters, aged 12 and up, get to have their say or their questions answered every night.

The topics range from the certainly silly (bust lust) to the deadly serious (AIDS).
