Commemorative Planting Guide

In keeping with Prudence Memorial Park's Rules and Regulations, native plants may be placed on individual burial sites, but they must be approved by PMP management prior to planting to ensure these plants are natural, appropriate to the specific location, and noninvasive. The following list includes a variety of plant types that are suitable for planting in the varied exposure and soil moisture conditions found within the Park. This list is intended to present a wide selection that will, over time, promote biodiversity on the landscape to support the widest variety of wildlife, primarily pollinators and birds, across multiple seasons. However, additional resources are available (such as the Native Plant Trust's Garden Plant Finder [<https://plantfinder.nativeplanttrust.org/Plant-Search>]) and numerous guides to the region's flora) from which individuals may identify an alternate plant selection for pre-approval by PMP management. In no instance will the use of fertilizer or non-native, non-locally sourced mulch material be incorporated in any plantings within the park.

Note:

- Any plant material installed on cemetery grounds without the approval of PMP management may be removed without notice.
- Tree species marked with an asterisk are not available selections for individuals purchasing burial rights after October 1, 2023. The Park, due to its modest size, simply cannot support multiple plantings of larger trees (greater than thirty feet in height). Tree selections are restricted to those that serve as an appropriate understory component with limited spread.
