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Welcome to American English Academy

We're excited to welcome you to the United States and to the American English Academy! This Pre-Arrival Packet contains important information to help you prepare for your journey, ensure a smooth arrival, and start your studies with confidence.

Our Mission Statement

The American English Academy provides language instruction and cultural training to both domestic and international students in response to their language needs and educational objectives.

Part I: Enrollment and Registration Policy

1. Eligibility for Enrollment

Students must meet the following eligibility requirements to enroll at AEA:

- Submission of a completed application form.
- Must be at least 18 years old.
- For international students: (F-1 visa or change of status documentation).
- Payment of all applicable registration and tuition fees.
- The student must be a non-native speaker of English.
- The student must be able to read and write in his/her native language

2. Registration Procedures

- Students must register for classes prior to the start of each academic term.
- Registration is completed through the AEA administrative office or online as directed.
- Students are required to register for a full-time course load.

3. Deadlines

- Regular registration must be completed before the first day of class.
- Late registration is permitted within the second week of the term

4. Full-Time Requirements

- Full-time enrollment is mandatory for all F-1 students
- A full-time course load at AEA consists of 20 hours per week

5. Changes to Enrollment

- Any changes to a student's enrollment status, such as withdrawals, leave of absence, or program changes, must be requested in writing and submitted to the DSO for approval.
- Students withdrawing or changing programs must also meet immigration reporting requirements if applicable.

6. Communication of Policies

• Enrollment and registration policies are communicated to students during orientation, published in the Student Handbook.

7. Refund Policy

- The registration fee is non-refundable.
- 50% tuition refund if the student drops out during the first week of classes.
- No refund after the first week of classes.
- A refund will be credited electronically via Stripe.

Part II: Planning Your Arrival

Arrival Time: Arrive at least **4 days before classes begin** to adjust, take your placement test, and get settled.

How to Apply for the F-1 Visa:

- 1. Obtain your I-20 form with AEA
- 2. Schedule a visa interview through your nearest U.S. embassy or consulate: www.usembassy.gov

F-1 Interview Checklist:

- Valid passport
- Visa photo(s)
- Proof of visa fee and SEVIS fee payments
- DS-160 application form
- I-20 form and acceptance letter from AEA
- Proof of financial support and home country ties

Part III: After You Arrive – U.S. Customs

At the airport, have ready (do not pack inside luggage):

- Passport
- I-20
- Contact details for AEA's DSO

Expect questions about:

• Your visit's purpose, school, fees paid, return plans

Missing I-20? You may be granted temporary entry with a Form I-515A. Follow instructions and submit requested documents within 30 days. AEA's DSO can assist you.

Part V: Academics, Classes, & Orientation

Placement Test: Student placement into appropriate course levels is critical to ensuring academic success. Occasionally, adjustments to a student's initial placement may be necessary based on academic performance, teacher observations, and additional diagnostic evaluations during the first week of the term.

Books: Available for purchase at AEA. Cost: approx. \$50 per level.

Program Options:

- American English Experience Program: 20 hours. /week, all skills (CEFR A1–C1)
- TOEFL iBT Preparation Program: 20 hours/week, for high-intermediate and advanced students

Schedules:

- Mon–Thurs: Morning (9am–2pm) or Evening (5pm–10pm)
- Fri & Sat: 9am–6pm

Orientation: Held on the first day of class. Mandatory for F-1 students. Covers:

- Class expectations
- Academic and immigration policies
- Campus life and U.S. living basics

Maximum time to complete the course:

To complete the full course of study, the maximum time permitted is 16 terms. This is because we offer eight levels, and each level spans one term.

Attendance Policy

- Expected Attendance: Students must attend at least 80% of total class hours
- Tardiness: Arriving 15+ minutes late may be marked as late or absent
- F-1 Students: Required to maintain full-time enrollment and consistent attendance
- Termination: If absent more than 8 days in a term

Part VI: Student Conduct & Academic Policies

Attendance: Minimum 80% required (max. 8 absences per term). Tardiness: More than 15 minutes late = marked late. Progress: Must earn A or B to advance levels. Limit on repeating a level: Students may repeat the same level once for the American English Experience Program and twice for the TOEFL Preparation Program. Maximum time to complete the course: To complete the full course of study, the maximum time permitted is 16 terms. This is because we offer eight levels, and each level spans one term.
