Darlene Rittel

Darlene has been employed as a Speech Language Pathologist with the Aiken County Public School District for over 30 years. The last eight years she has been assigned to Pinecrest Center. This site houses preschool classes for the 4K-Child Development Program. A major responsibility of her position is to screen and evaluate preschool children from across the county to identify any speech-language disorders and determine whether or not therapy is needed. Each year she evaluates more than 125 preschool children; and screens at least twice that many. She is also responsible for screening, evaluating and serving the 4-year old students at Pinecrest Center. In addition to providing speech therapy, Darlene is also the Coordinator for the Student Support Team at the school. In this role she is responsible for receiving referrals from teachers or parents if a student demonstrates educational concerns. The team meets and plans strategies and interventions to help the student be more successful at school. Darlene manages all the paperwork, schedules the meetings and maintains documentation for these referrals.

Darlene is an active member of the Greater Aiken Estates Neighborhood Association. This volunteer association strives to increase interactions with residents in the neighborhood, maintain appearance of the neighborhood, provide residents with pertinent information about property ownership and regulations, and support the Neighborhood Watch Program. The association has two formal meetings each year, with several other projects during the year. Darlene participated in the meetings, neighborhood yard sale, door-to-door canvassing for new members, and a potluck picnic where residents could get to know one another. In our fast paced society, frequently people do not even know their neighbors. This association attempts to address this phenomenon in hopes that, by knowing neighbors, regard, respect and understanding for one another will increase.
