2011 GFWC-SC Reporting Information

Community Service Program Reports and Special Project/Advancement Reports must be submitted on the appropriate GFWC Reporting Form, available on the GFWC website and postmarked on or before February 1, 2012.

Reporting period is January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011. No projections should be made in these reports. TWO (2) separate copies of the club's reports (the GFWC report form with narratives stapled to it) must be sent to the GFWC-SC Second Vice President, Caroline Richardson Mahaffey, PO Box 39, Simpsonville, SC 29681.

Write the name of the report in the upper right hand corner of the report.

The number of members is the number of members as of April 30, 2011, and included on the club roster in the President's Packet.

ONE (1) copy of the Community Service Program and Special Project Reports should be mailed or faxed to GFWC, Dept. P., 1734 N Street NW, Washington, DC 20036. Fax Number: 202-835-0246.

GFWC Online Reporting is available and encouraged. The Guide to Online Reporting may be found on the GFWC Website. GFWC-SC does not have an online reporting option. HOWEVER, clubs may choose to report by email. If you choose this option, you must still send one paper copy to the 2nd VP.

Junior clubs must submit TWO additional copies to the Director of Junior Clubs, Michele Hood at 313 Lapwing Lane, Mt. Pleasant, SC 29464, OR by e-mail at: micheleh0313@aol.com.

Reports should include a narrative consisting of up to, but not more than two, single spaced typed pages per program. **DO NOT COMBINE NARRATIVES.** Narratives should have the name of the program/project/advancement area, as well as the club name and person writing the report in the upper right hand corner.

If you choose not to include a narrative with your state reports, the club is ineligible for consideration of state awards. However, the hours, number of club members participating and dollars donated or spent on projects will be included in the totals for composite state reports, which are then reported to GFWC.

Addenda (supporting documents) are optional on all reports, are limited to 5 pages and must be stapled to one copy of the report clearly marked "FOR JUDGING" (this is the copy sent to the Second Vice President.) Do not send the addenda with reports going to GFWC.

If emailing, each report should be sent by separate email to rrealestcm@aol.com with the name of the Community Service Program, Special Project or Advancement area in the subject line.

The Community Improvement Program Report must be postmarked no later than March 10, 2012, and sent to ShirLee Alfors at 117 Rocky Trail Court, Fort Mill, SC 29715.

State Silver and District Award Reports must be postmarked on or before March 15, 2012, and submitted on the 2011 GFWC-SC Report Form (copy included in President's Packet and in this magazine issue). Person receiving and/or judging the report will be listed with specific award information in this magazine.

All activities reported must be club approved projects. A project/program may not be reported in more than one Community Service Program Report or Special Project/Advancement Area (this is cross-reporting); however, a project/program may be reported again in a State/District Silver Award Report.

Certificates of Award will be given to the 1st and 2nd winning entries in each of the three (3) general membership categories and two (2) junior membership categories, and one (1) juniorette category.

General Categories

Category I 1 -15 members
Category II 1-29 members
Category III 30 and up members

Junior Categories

Category I 1-35 members
Category II 36 and up members

Total hours spent and total monies donated will be evaluated on a PER CAPITA BASIS for all clubs.

If you would like to be informed of receipt of reports, please include a stamped, self-addressed postcard with your reports.

- 5. Community participation (any outside organizations or individuals that were involved and how).
- Publicity for project, club, GFWC-SC, GFWC.
- 7. Success of project (impact on community).
- 8. Any additional information requested by the award sponsor relating to the particular award.

GFWC-SC Program Council Report: DONOR - GFWC-SC Program Council. BASIS - To the general club which most effectively carries out the GFWC Program Guidelines. First place in each general membership category receives silver that the club retains. RE-PORTING INSTRUCTIONS: Summarize club work from January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2011. Report is limited to SEVEN (7) pages – cover, narrative double-spaced and FIVE (5) pages addendum (which is optional). First page heading should include name of club, district and number of members paid to GFWC-SC Treasurer by April 30, 2010. Report each Community Service Program: ARTS Partnership, and Collaboration, CONSERVATION Partnership and Collaboration, EDUCATION Partnership and Collaboration, HOME LIFE Partnership and Collaboration, INTERNATIONAL OUTREACH Partnership and Collaboration, and PUBLIC ISSUES Partnership and Collaboration (total of 12) separately. Include in your report a brief description of the programs and projects of your club. Describe briefly visual aids used such as exhibits, workshops, publications, etc. List other activities or contributions (money, time, etc.) which in any manner promoted GFWC Programs. If you include a narrative, be certain to check the narrative included box on the reporting form. Report should be submitted to the Second Vice President, Caroline Richardson Mahaffey, PO Box 39, Simpsonville, SC 29681, postmarked on or before March 15, 2012.

Community Service Program Overall Club Awards: Awards for the best club projects as determined by the GFWC-SC /Program Chairmen in each of the Community Service Partnership and Collaboration Programs.
