





Jennie Award, Gail Elfert

Did you know? The **Jennie Award** is the only national honor bestowed by GFWC that recognizes individual members for personal excellence!

The **Jennie Award** is named in honor of GFWC's founder, Jane Cunningham Croly, who wrote for national newspapers under the pseudonym, "Jennie June". The award is a way of highlighting and recognizing extraordinary clubwomen for a lifetime of personal excellence epitomizing Jennie June's spirit of independence, courage, and persistence through their roles as volunteers within their clubs, communities, and extended families.

Nominations will be evaluated in three areas on the following criteria:

- 1. <u>Commitment to Club</u> The nominee should have an outstanding record of success and achievement, not only in terms of her club's volunteer programs and projects, but also her role in a leadership position, her effort to build membership and promote the club to others, and her overall spirit of volunteerism. She should be kind, loyal, and positive in her relationships with other clubwomen, and her commitment should be continuous, rather than a onetime occurrence.
- 2. <u>Commitment to Community</u> Community service must address real community needs and concerns and this service should go beyond club activities and be carried out through other community organizations (e.g. schools, hospitals, elected or appointed positions, etc.) as well as through the workplace. Activities should reflect an innovative or unique approach to volunteer work.
- 3. <u>Commitment to Family</u> Recognizing that families come in many different forms, the nominee might be a single parent, a grandparent raising grandchildren, an adult caring for elderly relative, or an adult without children. The definition of a family member may include persons you are older or younger than the nominee. It may include immediate as well as extended family members. The nominee should exemplify outstanding concern for the wellbeing, health and welfare of one or more persons by providing aid and comfort on an ongoing basis, separate and apart from club and community work.

If your club would like to nominate someone who you believe fits all of these criteria and is worthy of such a high honor, then please go to the GFWC Website and find all the award rules for the <u>Jennie Award</u> in the <u>2020-2022 GFWC Club Manual</u>. The nominee must have been a member in good standing of a GFWC club for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years. And the <u>deadline for clubs submitting nomination materials to State President</u> is sooner than you think – <u>POSTMARKED by June 1, 2021</u>. Legislative Update, Janet H Watkins

The Capitol Building is closed to tours due to COVID 19. If there is a change in the policy, we will plan a GFWC-SC day at a latertime. Please stay tuned for more information. You can follow any legislation at https://www.scstatehouse.gov/legislation.php

Here are some updates on bills that we are following:

H.3200 -The bill has passed and was signed into law. It became effective on July 25, 2020. This bill requires employers to provide a time and place for nursing mothers to pump breast milk.

H 3028 In Education and Public Works Committee

A joint resolution to create the POW-MIA Chair of Honor Commission to identify and establish an appropriate location in the State House or on the grounds of the Capitol Complex upon which to place a POW-MIA National Chair of Honor to recognize, honor and increase public awareness regarding the nearly ninety thousand American services members who remain unaccounted for since the first World War.

H 3056 In Judiciary Committee

To amend Code of Laws of South Carolina relating to unlawful hazing and define necessary terms and restructure penalties associated with unlawful hazing.

S 194 (similar bills S 23, H 3074, H 3296) S 194 bill has passed the Senate, the other versions of the bill are still in Judiciary Committee. This bill would increase the penalties for soliciting prostitution and keeping a brothel. It would also provide a defense for victims of human trafficking who may be charged as prostitutes. Other versions include defense for those who are disabled and those who are minors.

H 3075 (Similar S 0305) In Judiciary Committee

The "Teen Dating Violence Prevention Act" defines terms, creates offenses and penalties, allows victims to seek protective and restraining orders, requires Teen Violence Curriculum to be taught to increase awareness. H 3151 In Education and Public Works Committee Requires school districts to screen all prospective and current employees through the Social Service Registry of Child Abuse and Neglect. Requires DSS to provide training for district personnel.

H 3181 In Judiciary Committee

Sex Trafficking Bill

A bill to revise the definition of sex trafficking to include exploitation and prostitution of minors including by oral, wire, or electronic communication; provide for an advocate for a minor; provide training for judges, prosecutors and law enforcement; to provide offense and penalty for promoting travel for sex trafficking

H 3063 (Similar H 3068) In Judiciary Committee

"Hate Crime Bill" Amends the Code of Laws to provide penalties to a person who assaults, intimidates or threatens a person because of his race religion color, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation or homelessness. To amend and revise penalties relating to malicious injury to personal and real property.

S 0311 (In Judiciary Committee)

This bill limits the liability of volunteers who provide transportation to Senior Citizens. This is a bill formally passed by resolution that GFWC-SC supports.

- 4. Decorations make some from items found around home or go online and purchase from a huge variety of recycled creations. Try to store favorites carefully so they can be used for several years. Avoid single use plastic items. Use LED lights.
- 5. Wrapping reuse previous wrappings when possible such as saved ribbons or large pieces of wrapping paper cut down for smaller packages and for gift tags. Use eco-friendly paper and bags. Consider alternative wrappings such as comic papers, or kitchen towels for baked goods, or decorate other shopping bags with holiday designs.
- 6. Food reduce food waste by planning ahead and buying only what you like and will need for baking and meals. Have storage containers handy and freeze leftovers immediately for future use (or send some goodies home with guests).

AFTER - Considerations as you are cleaning up and packing up for storage.:

- 1. Live trees your community may recycle for mulch or fish habitats. Check for curbside or drop off procedures.
- 2. Used Cards St. Jude's Ranch has a recycle program that helps abused, neglected, homeless children. Go to website at www.stjudesranch.org for details (this is not the hospital). Cards may also be used for lots of crafts for all ages. Perhaps a nursing home, daycare or art center could use some of your cards (with personal info cut off).
- 3. Shipping boxes most of us will flatten the boxes and recycle. But! www.huffpost.com/entry has very clever ways to reuse or repurpose boxes! Might be fun to try during cold days of January!
- 4. Lights check with your nearest Home Depot to see if they offer a collection of used light strings. They do have outlets for repurposing the materials in the strings. Also change to LEDs if you have not already done so.
- 5. Wrapping paper and bags much wrapping paper is NOT recyclable. Therefore, consider opening carefully and saving what you can for future wrappings or crafts. Some designs may be more generic so it may be used for other occasions.
- 6. Unwanted decorations if in good condition, donate to others: friends, family, thrift stores, charities, shelters, hospi tals, schools. Check various organizations to see if they could use the decorations. Or consider selling at a yard sale or on E-Bay. Perhaps even 're-gifting' next year if item is almost new or as a door prize. And of course, some may be dis assembled to use for crafts.

You can feel good about each action you take to be a good steward of our environment. Even small acts can have a big impact. It has been said that if every family in the US reused just two feet of ribbon, it would save over 38,000 miles of ribbon. Enough to tie around the planet!
