

As reported in last magazine, the response at Summer Board to the REDUCE PLASTICS service project was tremendous! Two carloads of plastic pill bottles (and a few other assorted items) were received. After many weeks of sorting, cleaning, counting, and mailing the results are in: 774 clean bottles and 737 other medicine bottles were mailed to Matthew 25: Ministries. The clean bottles will be used for medicines overseas in locations where patients may not have suitable containers for transporting or storing prescriptions. The other bottles (that had sticky labels) are sent to a recycling center and the Ministry receives payment for them. In addition, 82 plastic grocery bags were given to thrift stores, or placed in 'doggie doo' receptacles, or returned to grocery stores; and 16 large plastic juice bottles were given to a local school to use in their garden. A big shout out to all who participated in this effort to reduce plastics in landfills!

Another request to REDUCE PLASTIC was the "October count" activity requested by our national Environment chair, Karen Martinek. Results from this national effort of counting just plastic bottles and bags recycled were not available in time to include in this article, but we will eagerly await to see how club women in SC responded! Since this will be my last article for 2021, I want to remind and encourage you to report your various environment programs and projects for this year. For a refresher of possible activities that may qualify, please review GFWC manual for this CSP to see if your club and members approved any of these. One of my goals was to have clubs or members become AMBASSADORS against food waste. SCDHEC has a free, easy program for this and can be located at the website: www.scdhec.gov/dontwastfoodsc. (Attendance at Summer Board in August counts as part of this awareness.) Also remember to print off the Palmetto Pride application forms for litter projects. I fear that this important issue area may seem embedded and may be often overlooked.

Since some may not be aware of the form, I wished to draw attention to it in this article. The form can be found online at www.gfwc-sc.org then click on the "More" button. Next select "President Packet" from menu and scroll down to "Palmetto Pride". The forms are in alphabetical order, so scroll down to Palmetto Pride. There is one recognition for awareness and one for litter pick-ups. Clubs may submit for either one or both. (Again, attendance at Summer Board counts as part of awareness.)

Let's "pull off" another regal environmental project! Just keep collecting those aluminum pull tabs off cans. Put them in Ziploc bags and bring to Winter Board for a service project in January. The member with the most pull tabs will be royally recognized and all the tabs will then be given to the Ronald McDonald House in Charleston. A jewel of an idea from our President, Kristin!

With the holidays and gift-giving approaching, please consider using recycled gifts and decorating ideas. This is a way to keep some items out of landfills and it is so easy to shop online and locally for these unique, creative, and reasonable gifts. Plus, there is the advantage of social distancing to avoid big crowds of strangers and quicker checkouts. A quick search on Google for "gifts from recycled materials" reveals a wealth of items in numerous categories that are not just rubber stamp things imported for big box stores. In my mind it is a "RIGHT thing" to do.

February is Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month.

Teen Dating Violence occurs between two people in a close relationship and includes four types of behavior: **physical violence, sexual violence, stalking and psychological aggression**.

Did you know that 1 in 3 young people will be in an abusive or unhealthy relationship?? 33% of adolescents in America are victim to sexual, physical, verbal, or emotional dating abuse and 1 in every 5 high school students report being physically and/or sexually abused by a dating partner.

Both young woman and young men can find themselves in a violent relationship.

Awareness and information is the key.

The challenge for February is to bring this awareness to the students. Arrange with your local High School or College, a conversational forum where students can learn and ask questions about Teen Dating Violence and how to avoid this violence in their lives.

This is not a subject that we as clubwoman can address. Make sure that you have a licensed rape counselor or domestic violence counselor is in attendance to assist in providing the information, answering questions and assisting any young person in need.

Resources to end Teen Dating Violence is out there. Getting that information to the young people who may need it is the challenge.

Guest Speaker: Author, Mary-Ellen Stroup


Wife, mother, grandmother, Mary-Ellen once believed life consisted of finding a home where you settle and stay forever in one place. Not so. Instead, her life became more like the motto of the moving company—"an adventure in moving—as she has lived in six states and three countries. Those experiences created work, pain, unknowns and an abiding love of each place and its people. Whether it was the business world, pastoral ministry in three areas from the Midwest to New England, being a classroom teacher or the international missionary life of 20 years, God has taught her that his plans and purposes are treasures beyond value, blessings to anticipate and surprises to enjoy.

Mary-Ellen has become known affectionately (or is it deliciously?) as "The Cheesecake Lady". Cheesecakes for Causes is her project, born out of a fundraiser to build a basketball court in Africa as a memorial for her youngest son. She bakes for individuals and also for groups' fund raisers who choose from over a dozen kinds of cheesecakes. One such cake donated to a Silent Auction was seen by a member of the Woman's Club of York County. That began a sweet relationship with the club which enjoyed a very successful cheesecake fundraiser in May and has plans for another one in 2022. (And this seems to have brought Mary-Ellen to our meeting in Columbia!)

This year Mary-Ellen became an author of A Bunk Bed, A Banana Tree and A Dog, a book of personal letters and recollections, it unfolds decades of a family's growing faith in God while missionaries in a developing country. Never intended originally for anyone's eyes except their parents, these letters were compiled by the author for her adult children to read and relive the life they loved growing up in Zaire, Africa (Democratic Republic of Congo). Often considered by others to be a unique life, in reading you may encounter the unique, but guaranteed are also some boring details that were not omitted in the copying process so the children would understand what life involved for their parents.

Whether unique, difficult, or boring, life in Zaire was deemed a privilege by Mary-Ellen and her husband, who regard themselves as simply obedient to a call to it out of their deep love for Jesus, their Lord and Savior who loved them and gave his life for them.

Besides the fun of Cheesecakes for Causes, you will find Mary-Ellen today enjoying welcoming guests to her Camden, SC home, playing violin, volunteering at state prisons, loving 8 grandchildren, travel and beach walks with her husband of 50 plus years, Bill.
