The start of a new year is an excellent time for your club to review your bylaws and amend any that are out of date.

Here are some relevant parts of your bylaws to review:

Purpose of your club - does your purpose statement still accurately reflect what your club does - and doesn't - do? Your 401(c)(3) status is dependent upon your organization's purpose so make sure this is still accurate. Consult a lawyer if you have any questions regarding your purpose. Meetings - have you added information to your bylaws regarding how your club functions during an emergency - our covid pandemic proved the need for this to be included. Some things to include are who makes decisions regarding holding meetings remotely, what remote platform will be utilized, and how will discussions, questions, elections, and voting be handled when meeting remotely.

How your club runs - what has changed with your club but not reflected in your bylaws? Looks at membership, dues, officer duties, fundraising, committees, and more. And don't forget your Standing Rules! All of these are vital to the success of your club.

I know reading bylaws is not fun but they are there for an important reason. Encourage your club members to consult them and by all means, amend them when necessary.

2020-2022 Jennie Award winner- Anne Redlus

The Jennie Award is the only national honor bestowed by GFWC that recognizes individual members for personal excellence and achievements and for extraordinary contributions to their clubs, communities, and families. The 2020-2022 Jennie Award winner for GFWC-SC is Anne Redlus, the founding member of the GFWC Woman's League of the Lowcountry!

Anne's club had a difficult time including all of her accomplishments in the limited number of pages allowed in the nomination, but they did a great job communicating how much they believed Anne deserved the award and how proud they were of their "mentor, role model and cheerleader" as they described her.

Briefly, Anne began her GFWC journey and fell in love with the organization when she attended her first Junior meeting in Mt. Holly, New Jersey in 1975. After 39 years of devoted service to GFWC in New Jersey and on the international level, including serving as State President 2008-2010 and serving as GFWC Home Life Chairman 2010-2012 and International Outreach Chairman 2012-2014, Anne and her husband Howard, moved to Bluffton SC in 2014. Because there was no GFWC club nearby, Anne reached out to SC State and District leaders for assistance in starting a new club. Due to her diligence in advertising, inviting and enticing neighbors and residents in the area, 38 interested ladies came to the first "introductory" meeting. On March 15, 2015, the GFWC Woman's League of the Lowcountry was chartered, and Anne served as President for the first three years while simultaneously holding positions at the State and District level.

Anne has held a state position or office almost every year since joining her first GFWC club in 1975, and she has continued her devotion to and involvement with GFWC since moving to South Carolina by serving as District President, GFWC Jennie Award Chairman and as one of the 2020-2022 President's Assistants.

A few of the many activities Anne has been involved with, led, or even started in her club, church and community are: Canine Companions for Independence (she has raised 5 puppies!) St. Jude's Walk (collecting over \$9000); Operation Smile (sewing countless numbers of surgical gowns and "nono" arm bands); Military Women's Veterans Tea; Church Soup Kitchen, Bridge of Hope for homeless women, Christmas Stockings for the Military; Red Cedar Elementary School Cereal Drive Guinness World Record; Annual Christmas Poinsettia Sale (from 1986 to present); GED Education and Scholarship; Backpack Buddies, Family Promise; transporting seniors to doctor appointments and grocery shopping; and tutoring in Agape after-school program.

Anne has been married to her husband Howard Redlus for 51 years, and they are the parents of Mark, Leigh, and Eric, and grandparents of Katherine and Elizabeth. She is a retired Speech Therapist and worked as a bookkeeper in her husband's Veterinary practice in New Jersey. She was recently elected as an elder in her church, Low Country Presbyterian Church.

But, when it comes to locating the reporting form for the Palmetto Pride awards, I might have to agree with Kermit. This particular form is rather embedded deeply in the President's Packets online and not easy to find. Although the Feb 1st deadline is past, and hopefully all clubs reported their litter projects for 2021, there is still time to complete the form for this recognition. Please go to gfwc-sc.org, then click on 'more' then select 'Presidents Packet' from drop down menu. Finally scroll all the way down to Palmetto Pride and print/download the form. The awards will be presented at the state convention in April. But please send me a copy of this report by March 1st so that I can reflect the efforts SC clubwomen have made in reducing and combatting litter when I compile my state report. And don't forget to report the DHEC food waste AMBASSADOR program during 2021. Go to www.scdhec.gov/dontwastefoodsc for details. You can include your club approved activities in the CSP report, but then will need to email completed form to DHEC and of course cc me. There is not an award for this activity, but I hope to gather stats from DHEC to put in my report.

IT'S SO EASY to check out the fantastic environmental resources in our state and in our nation with simple google searches. Especially now to get project ideas as we begin a new reporting period. GFWC provides a nice list of organizations in the club manual with a host varied topics. It is well worth your time to peruse these and appreciate the work being done by thousands across the globe. We are aware of Palmetto Pride and DHEC in SC but may wish to further explore their numerous outreach programs, school curriculums, and resources. Project Learning Tree is a national organization with excellent educational activities for children. Our state coordinator is Matt Schnabel in Columbia at the Forestry Commission. Linda Sinclair, a member of Lexington Woman's Club, is a retired Science Coordinator with DOE and encourages all members to check out programs at state parks. Other possibilities include: the Carolina Recycling Association, Teen Science Café's, and the USC Student Ambassador Sustainability program. 

<u>H. 4517</u> (Word version) -- Rep. Gilliard: A BILL TO ENACT THE "RACIALLY RESTRICTIVE COVENANT REMOVAL ACT" (Sent to Judiciary)

<u>H. 4521</u> (Word version) -- Rep. Rutherford: A BILL TO PROVIDE THE LOTTERY COMMISSION LAWFULLY MAY OWN, MARKET, AND REGULATE CERTAIN CASH DEPOSIT-ACTIVATED GAMES OF SKILL MACHINES THAT SKILLED PLAYERS MAY PLAY TO EARN PRIZES (Sent to Judiciary)
