

Just a few tips and reminders for all club and district secretaries.

You all know it is our job to record accurately the minutes of all club meetings. Remember to include the title of each meeting, the date and the time, and location of the meeting.

Example: GFWC-SC Summer Session, July 23, 2016 10:00 a.m., Saluda River Baptist Church, West Columbia, SC.

Also include those in attendance. Remember the minutes are the official record of the final decisions made. You do NOT have to include all the discussion involved in the issue, you just record the final decisions.

It is very helpful if you arrive early at each meeting, that way you will be prepared and ready when the meeting begins. Also if you are there ahead of time, it will be easier for members to give you copies of their reports ahead of time. It is a good policy to ask (really insist, but in a nice way) all chairmen and officers to give you their reports in writing. It is even better if they give you the reports before the meeting begins.

Upcoming Important Dates

IRS Return

The e-Postcard (Form 990-N, Electronic Notice for Tax-Exempt Organizations Not Required to File Form 990 or Form 990EZ, is used by small, tax-exempt organizations for annual reporting and can only be submitted electronically) and is due every year by the **15th day of the 5th month after the close of your tax year.** For example, if your tax year ended on December 31, the e-Postcard is due May 15 of the following year. If the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the due date is the next business day. You cannot file the e-Postcard until after your tax year ends.

There is a new process this year. Electronic submissions should now be made through IRS. gov instead of Urban Institute's website, as was done in the previous years. Form 990-N filers will be required to complete a short, one-time registration before submitting their electronic form to IRS.gov.

SC Secretary Of State Charitable Organization Registration

Annual Financial Report for a Charitable Organization - This form is used by the charitable organization to report financial information to the Secretary of State on an annual basis (4 ½ months after the close of the charitable organization's fiscal year). No Fee.

Application For Registration Exemption - This form is used by charitable organizations that are exempt from registration requirements. This form should be submitted to the Secretary of State's Office on an annual basis (4 ½ months after the close of the charitable organization's fiscal year). No Fee.

Registration Statement for a Charitable Organization - This form is used by the charitable organization to register with the Secretary of State's Office on an annual basis (4 ½ months after the close of the charitable organization's fiscal year). \$50.00.

SC Secretary Of State Raffle Registration

Generally, in order to conduct a raffle, a nonprofit organization must file an annual raffle registration form with the SC Secretary of State Division of Public Charities. The annual Raffle Registration Form is available on the Secretary of State's website at www.sos.sc.gov, under Forms and Fees. The raffle registration includes a \$50.00 filing fee. Registered organizations are required to file an annual Raffle Financial Report with the Division of Public Charities, 4½ months after the end of their fiscal year. This form is also available on the Secretary of State's website (includes itemized receipts/expenditures for each "non-exempt" raffle). This form is also available on the Secretary of State's website. \$50.00.

Club Remittance Form (with Dues)

The Club Remittance Form – located on GFWC-SC Website, is due by November 1, 2016. Mail Club Remittance form, check for dues (payable to GFWC-SC), and a copy of your corrected membership roster postmarked by November 1. An electronic copy of your club roster, e-mailed to wfwkew@comporium.net, rather than hardcopy, would be greatly appreciated. Please see www.IRS.gov and www.sos.sc.gov for additional information.

GFWC-SC Clubs should choose a project and make plans to carry out the project. Clubs should submit an application to SCFWC Progress Foundation for a grant to help fund your project. Ask for an amount that your club can match and that the Foundation will be able to fund. Remember that investments have not made the same return in previous years. Be sure to mail a copy of the application to the Chairman, the Secretary, and the Treasurer of the Foundation. The application must be postmarked by November 15. The project should come from the list on the back of the application that was in the President's Packet provided at the Presidents' Institute. Only the Clubs whose dues have been paid on time and have written a 'Thank You note' for a grant given in the previous year will be considered for a Grant. Grant Applications can be found in the Presidents' Packet given out at Presidents' Institution.

This is a little history of SCFWC Progress Foundation. General Federation of Women's Clubs of South Carolina are indebted to those who have gone before for their wisdom and foresight for establishing South Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs Progress Foundation. The Executive Committee of South Carolina Women's Clubs created Progress Foundation on August 31, 1951. Many club women and businesses donated to the Foundation. This gave the Foundation money to make donations from the interest earned on the Fund to provide the clubs of General Federation of Women's Clubs with money to supplement each club's donation to community service. This Foundation was established and organized and shall operate exclusively for charitable, educational, literary and scientific purposes, and for the prevention of cruelty to children, all exclusively, within the state of South Carolina. The Foundation may not profit any individual or any private shareholder. Upon Termination of this Foundation all property of the Foundation of whatsoever type and whatsoever situation, shall be conveyed and distributed in equal shares to the tax supported county libraries in South Carolina, and if none are in existence at such time, then said property of the Foundation for use of other property and funds of S.C. Industrial Schools [Penal] in equal shares to each school.

This information came from the SCFWC Yearbook for 1979-1980. In this Yearbook there is a complete list of donors to the Foundation. Additional Funds are not really needed in this Foundation.



What Color is YOUR Cancer?



Dyslexia Awareness

Who Determines Cancer Awareness Colors

When I started my research on this project, I was amazed that there were so many cancer colors. Surprisingly, the American Cancer Society is not responsible; they provide many services and research funding but are not involved with the cancer color awareness.

It began in the 1980's when Susan G. Komen, a small grassroots organization born to bring awareness for breast cancer, created the "Pink Ribbon!" We all know the rest of that story and how it has become a nationwide campaign.

Other organizations jumped on the ribbon bandwagon and cancer awareness colors such as Teal for Ovarian Cancer, Light Blue for Prostate Cancer, and many others were introduced by non-profit organizations. In the 90's the Childhood Cancer Organization banded together and chose Gold (because our children are as precious as gold). Organizations such as the Lung Cancer Alliance, the National Cervical Cancer Coalition, the Colon Cancer Alliance, among many other cancer organization have assigned or acknowledged a color for their cancer.

We would encourage our GFWC-SC clubs to bring awareness to the cancer or cancers you choose by using the Calendar of Cancer Awareness Months provided below. September has six cancers, October has two, and November five. Create any project, participate in the walks or runs for your cause, invite a nurse, doctor, or survivor to speak at your meeting and bring friends. Put together "Bags of Hope" and deliver them to your local oncology centers or doctor's offices. You can go to the site, Choose Hope, for materials you may want to purchase. I have taken my information from this very useful source.

One of our GFWC-SC President's Special Projects for the 2016-2018 administration is "Dyslexia Awareness." Since Janet's husband and both daughters have varying levels of dyslexia, this is a topic of great interest to our President. Even though we have all heard of dyslexia, most of us have only a vague understanding of what it really is and how it affects the way people learn and function in their daily lives. Therefore, each club is encouraged to have a speaker or take on a project to increase your understanding and awareness of dyslexia; work with and support a school in your area that specializes in teaching young people with this language based learning disability; and even help to fund scholarships for teachers to get specialized training so they can learn to recognize the disability and help their students learn more effectively.

International Outreach Community Service Program

This year's GFWC-SC state project for International Outreach was announced at Summer Board on July 23. We are excited to be partnering with Free The Girls, as we think this is a 'perfect fit' for GFWC-SC.

WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

Currently 20-37 million men, women and children are being held as slaves around the world—more today than in any other time in history. The majority of those

slaves are women and girls—many of whom are victims of sex trafficking. There are a number of amazing organizations that are helping to rescue these women out of a life of prostitution, but what happens after they are rescued?

Free The Girls' Solution

By partnering with established after-care facilities, Free The Girls provides an opportunity for sex trafficking survivors to build their own business selling second-hand clothing while going to school, establishing a house, and caring for their families. Selling clothes allows them to work as much or as little as their schedule permits. Women in the program receive their starting inventory as a donation, and are then able to buy additional inventory from Free The Girls for below wholesale value to help maintain their competitive edge in the marketplace. Revenue from inventory sales covers overseas program costs so the international programs are sustainable. FTG works one-on-one with each budding entrepreneur in areas like inventory management, budgeting, and financial planning for future dreams and goals they want to achieve.

WHY BRAS?

Let's face it, ladies: the back of your lingerie drawer is most likely a graveyard of bras you don't wear anymore or that never fit right in the first place. By contrast, second-hand clothing is a profitable market in many countries around the world. Bras are sought after items. And even better, bras provide an opportunity for these women to work with other women, since they have a history of being abused and used by men.

THE INSPIRATION

Free The Girls is inspired by the love of Christ to love all people and to fight for justice and wholeness for survivors of sex trafficking. They embrace and care for these women and girls regardless of their religion. The desire is to see a world where all are free.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

What GFWC-SC is suggesting now is to donate a bra or host a bra drive. Enlist a local boutique to be a bra drop-off location. Host a club social where the 'entry fee' is a bra. Clean out your lingerie drawer. Ask your club members, daughters and friends, book club, bunco and bridge groups, Sunday School and Bible Study groups to do the same. Once bras are collected, you may ship them to:

What's it to you?

In 1869, when Jane Cunningham Croley and other women journalists were denied tickets to hear Charles Dickens speak in New York City, a small voice whispered "What's it to you?" and Croley formed a club, Sorosis, which aimed for the "collective elevation and advancement" of women.

In 1906, when snake-oil tonics and adulterated foods and drinks deprived citizens of their health and well-being, a small voice whispered "What's it to you?" and our GFWC foremothers undertook a letter-writing campaign credited with the passage of the Prue Food and Drug Act.

In 1944, when a fascist government based on raciest principles waged war to rule the world, a small voice



whispered "What's it to you?" and our GFWC foremothers raised 154 million dollars through the Buy a Bomber Campaign, funding the purchase of 431 planes to protect and promote democracy.

In the 1970s, when our country was plagued with a sharp rise in violent crime, a small voiced whispered "What's it to you?" and our GFWC foremothers brainstormed and lead a grassroots campaign, Hands Up, and were commend by President Gerald Ford for their ingenuity and initiative.

For more than 125 years GFWC members have engaged in collective effort, collective advocacy, collective giving, and collective thinking, not only for Croly's initial aim for women, but for the benefit of all, advancing society into more enlightened times.

Together collectively, we have the power to conceive, design, and effect change. And yet the voice still whispers. What's it to you that poverty-stricken school children have little or no food on weekends?

What's it to you that Alzheimer's disease robs many sufferers of their memory and other vital mental functions in what should be the most rewarding years of their life?

What's it to you that human trafficking, a multi-billion dollar criminal industry, denies freedom to 21 million people through sexual slavery, sexual exploitation, and forced labor?

What's it to you that children around the world continue to die from preventable diseases?

What's it to you that violent intimate relationships persist in modern society?

I'm here today because I believe in the power of GFWC. I believe we are women that not only hear the question, but that can answer the question, and perhaps even more importantly in today's divided society, are able to put aside small differences to work for change, knowing that in the big things in life, we are at one.

In my efforts as GFWC Treasurer, Secretary, and Second Vice President, I have committed myself whole-heartedly to our organization, and today, I pledge to you again my loyalty, diligence, and best work.

I have no doubt that the world is a better place because of GFWC, or that we can continue to shape the fabric of our culture. Indeed, we must, because the culture we shape today becomes the future.
