Did You Know...



The suffrage movement's official beginning took place at the Seneca Falls (NY) Woman's Rights Convention held in 1848, but it would be another seventy two years (August 18, 1920) before the Nineteenth Amendment allowing all American women to vote was ratified and part our of Constitution. The March-April issue of the GFWC Clubwoman magazine has a wonderful one page suffrage pop quiz for GFWC members that I encourage clubs to share with their members by sharing facts via their club newsletters, websites and social media pages. GFWC has proudly endorsed the development of the Turning Point Suffragist Memorial to be located in Occóquan Regional Park in Fairfax County, Virginia, so your club could also choose to donate funds to this memorial. You can find educational materials and ways to support the memorial at the website, http://www.suffragistmemorial.org/. Under the website's Education tab, you can find a wonderful article on GFWC and Suffrage. You can also find some suffrage videos posted on YouTube, including a classic from my childhood, The Schoolhouse Rock cartoon on the 19th Amendment, which could be shared at a club meeting.

Exercising our right to vote is vital to improving our communities, to ending domestic violence, and to protecting our children. GFWC has provided a wonderful tool to insure that our

elected officials in D.C. hear our voice. It is called the Legislative Action Center. The Center allows you to track bills, contact your local representative and take action on issues germane to GFWC Resolutions. Just sign up to be on the Center's mailing list, http://www.gfwc.org/legislative-action-center/ At the GFWC Convention at the end of June, I attended the workshop on Public Policy and Legislation and learned that GFWC is able to provide each state with a list of members that have signed up for the mailing list along with the number of times the member has taken action on an GFWC issue. Only 83 of our GF-WC-SC members are on the mailing list, and of that eighty three, only 20 have taken action more than two times. The voice of GFWC-SC is not being heard in D.C. A great program or project for your club this year would be to sign up your members for the mailing list, educate members about the GFWC Resolutions and review the laws GFWC took action on last year.

Projects or programs on the suffrage movement or on the Legislative Action Center may just land you a few new members, especially if your club publicizes its project or program via social media. GFWC Junior Director Jolie Frankfurth told us at our state convention in April that Millenials (women age 15-35) identify most with a project, not an organization. These young ladies want to see photos of Clubwomen working in the community, not photos of Clubwomen having lunch. Sharing the suffrage videos or posting information on pending legislation via your club's Facebook page or website will connect your club with a cause, with a passion-exactly what younger women are looking for.

Fall is usually a busy time for most of our Club Treasurers. Tasks high on the Treasurer "To Do" List are:

IRS Tax or Informational Return Filing. Although your club is exempt from in come taxation, you are required to file an <u>annual return</u> of your income and expenses with the Internal Revenue Service. Small tax-exempt organizations with gross receipts ≤ \$50,000 can file an annual electronic notice. The 990-N or E-Postcard (electronic notice) filing is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of your tax year.

Secretary of State Registration or Exemption: The Registration Statement for a Charitable Organization or The Application For Registration Exemption, and the Annual Financial Report for a Charitable Organization are all due on an annual basis 4 1/2 months after the close your club's fiscal year. Please see http://www.sos.sc.gov/Public Charities/Public Charities Info.

Secretary of State Financial Report: Unless you have registered with the Secretary of State's Office for an Exemption your club may either submit the Secretary of State's Annual Financial Report Form or the IRS Form 990, 990-EZ or 990-PF. Please see http://www.sos.sc.gov/Public Charities/Public Charities Info.

GFWC-SC Raffle Report: If your club conducts "raffle" fund raisers - Please see http://www.sos.sc.gov/Raffles. Generally, in order to conduct a raffle, a nonprofit organization must file an annual raffle registration form with Division of Public Charities.

GFWC-SC Annual Dues: Annual dues shall be paid to the Treasurer on or before the first day of November.

Club and District Secretaries please remember that it is our job to record accurately the minutes of all club meetings. Include the title of each meeting, the date, the time, and location of each meeting. Include those in attendance. Remember that the minutes serve as the historical record of your club meetings. The minutes are the official record of the final decisions made. You do NOT have to include the discussion involved in an issue, you just record the final decisions.

All chairmen and officers should give you a copy of their reports in writing. You should attach their reports to the minutes. (It is also very helpful if they give you the reports before the meeting begins.)

Remind your club president and chairmen that the Club minutes are a great tool to use when writing their reports for GFWC-SC.

The GFWC Experience: More than Ourselves Marian St.Clair, GFWC First Vice President

Recently, I heard a friend describe his mother as a "joiner." I knew exactly what he meant.

I became a Girl Scout in grade school because I liked the uniform with its badges and exotic beret. As a young teenager, I was the only junior majorette in the marching band and struggled to keep up with the more senior girls, who didn't want to be caught dead with a 8th grader; and later I joined the Camera Club to be with the cool kids, though I didn't own a camera. Even as an adult, I didn't change. True to my nature, I joined St. Andrew's Woman's Club as a young mother, with no knowledge or skill in community service or civic engagement.

But that's okay, right? You understand; you're "joiners" too. So, here's the not-so-surprising outcome:

I perfected new skills as a scout and began to discover my natural talents, as well as the joys and pitfalls of group dynamics. The band took me beyond my small, rural town and broadened my horizons, giving me a better understanding of life and pushing me towards loftier goals. I learned to keep up with the big girls, or failing that, to smile and be the cute one, a skill that's not as useful at 59 as it was then. I found even without a camera, I could understand artistic principles and use them in other creative efforts and, surprisingly, I discovered the cool kids weren't all that different from anyone else.

Being a "joiner" has its benefits. I know you've discovered them too. In time, through success and failure, and the revelation of new experiences and self-knowledge, it's what makes us more than ourselves.

In my adult life, and yours too, it's GFWC that has continued to nurture our individual growth. We've gained friends, personal and professional skills, empathy for those who need our help, and the initiative to take things in hand and use our personal gifts for the greater good. But individual power is not always enough, that's why joining together is vital for sustained progress.

As a group, GFWC gives us the power of connection, combining our ability, our empathy, and our initiative, and in doing so, multiplies our personal power. Collective advocacy gives us a louder voice, collective effort and collective giving drives bigger improvement and broader influence, and collective thinking produces better ideas.






