GFWC-SC 109th Annual Convention Minutes

Greenville Marriott, Greenville, SC

April 20 - 22, 2007

- The Junior Naval ROTC from Greenville High School presented the colors.
- The Welcome was presented by Convention Chairmen Trudie Heemsoth, North Central District President and Lane Dye, Northwestern District President.
- Arts, Education and Public Affairs Department Awards were presented.
- Entertainment was provided by the After Hours Band at the Friday "Steppin Back" Banquet.
- The GFWC-SC Juniors held a Footlosse Fun Night- "It's a Mystery" Auction to benefit the Director of Junior's Special Project.
- Tammy Garland, GFWC-SC First Vice President presented the Honor Roll and Net Gain Club Awards, the Club and District Rating Sheet Awards.
- The Chicora Woman's Club in the Eastern District was recognized as a newly chartered club with twenty-nine (29) new members.
- Contribution Sheet Awards were presented by ShirLee Alfors, GFWC-SC Treasurer.
- GFWC-SC Officer Reports were given by President, Kathy Monahon, First Vice President, Tammy Garland, Second Vice President, Laurie O'Kelly, Recording Secretary, Jo Ann Bolchoz, Treasurer, ShirLee Alfors and Director of Junior Clubs, Linda Rodgers.
- The Trustees of GFWC-SC Report was given by Joni Tindall, Chairman. Motion to approve the \$2,000 payment to the GFWC-SC President for Travel for the 2007-2008 Club Year was adopted.
- The Trustees of the Progress Foundation Report was given by Sylvia Ayers, Chairman. Progress Foundation awards were distributed to 32 clubs totaling \$38,100.
- The Trustees of GFWC-SC Scholarship Endowment Report was given by Susie Childress. Nine scholarship recipients were determined eligible by the Scholarship Committee to receive \$2,905 in funding for the 2007-2008 Club Year.
- The Executive Board Report was presented by Jo Ann Bolchoz, Recording Secretary. The following motions were adopted:
 - Donation of \$200 to GFWC for the 1734 Front Entry Renovation Project; Nomination of Jackie Boland to the GFWC Southern District for Treasurer; Ratification to GFWC-SC membership of the Chicora Woman's Club as a new chartered club from the Eastern District with 29 members.
 - Program Council meeting was held.
 - The Headquarters Committee Report was presented by Ann Malpass, Chairman. The Committee reported checking account balance as of March 31, 2007 of \$5,003.25, a saving account balance of \$5,991.50 and the GFWC-SC Sims Stackhouse Mansion Endowment Fund balance of \$50,335.48.
 - The Finance Committee Report and the GFWC-SC Budget for 2007-2008 was presented by Nancy Boozer, Chairman. The General Fund Budget was adopted.
- The Constitution & Bylaws Committee Report was presented by Connie McFarland, Chairman. The proposed amendment to Article VII-Officers, Executive Committee, Executive Board, Board of Directors and Board of Trustees, Section 3 and Section 4 to a new Section 3 was adopted. The proposed amendment to Article XI -Nominations, Elections, and Vacancies was adopted. The proposed amendment to Article XIII- Standing Committees- Section 5 was adopted with a substitute Section B amendment and a Section C amendment added to the Bylaws.
- The elections from the district conferences were affirmed.
- Special Appointment and Special Project Reports were presented.
- International Affairs Department reports were presented.
- The Junior Luncheon, Business Meeting and Award Presentations were held on Saturday, April 21, 2007.
- Ellen Vincent from Clemson University presented a workshop on "Easy Care Landscaping for Public Areas".
- Conservation Department Awards were presented.
- Scrapbook and Yearbook Awards were presented; Photography Contests Awards were presented.
- A reception for first time attendees and Club Presidents was held.
- Entertainment for the Saturday Banquet was provided by Café and Then Some and the SC Governor's School Beohm Brass Sextet.
