GFWC-SC PRESIDENT'S State of the Federation and Remarks

Since my report to you at our 2005 Convention, I have continued to work to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office of State President. I timely submitted on April 1st my State President's report to GFWC, in which I reported 40 GFWC-SC clubs reported a total of 1859 projects, 71,437 hours and \$984,351 contributed during the 2005 reporting period. Although the number of reporting clubs decreased from 42 TO 40, our number of projects increased 266, our hours increased 11,746, and dollars increased by \$24,074.

Five GFWC-SC Clubs took advantage of GFWC's Mini-Grants – receiving a total of \$600.00: Community Improvement - Two SC clubs applied, two \$50 grants given: Lexington woman's Club, Lexington, SC & Jr. Woman's Club of Rock Hill, Rock Hill, SC; New Horizons in Health - Three SC clubs applied, three \$100 grants given: Saxe Gotha Woman's Club, Grand Strand Jr. Women's Club & Women's Society of Batesburg-Leesville; Literacy - One SC club applied, one \$200 grant given: Jr. Woman's Club of Rock Hill.

At our Southern Region Meeting during this administration, we have been asked to report on our Southern moments as State Presidents. Now, as State President, I have had moments of sadness and despair. Sadness at the loss of our dear GFWC-SC club members.

And despair as I learned and watched as so many of you and your love ones dealt with major illnesses, sadness and despair at the major natural disasters during this administration that caused such historic loss of life and property: the Tsunami, Hurricane Charlie, subsequently 4 hurricanes that devastated Florida in 2004, and then last but definitely not least Hurricane Katrina and Rita. But my heart fills with pride with how you rallied around our club members in their time of need and how you immediately responded to others in the wake of the disasters giving your time and donations.

As State President, my moments have been trying, frustrating, exasperating, maddening, wearisome, demanding, taxing, testing and difficult. Now "change" can cause moments like these.

During the 2004-2006 Administration we had several changes. First, there was a major change in the GFWC report form and reporting process, and it was a struggle on the state

level on how to best communicate these changes to you. I read all of the reports – even those where the font was almost too small for my magnifying glasses. I was so impressed with the creativity of the projects that were done this past reporting period. It appeared to me, however, that many of you are totally underestimating the value of your project – both in terms of hours and dollars. Next reporting period, please remember to give yourself full credit and that every member's time counts when calculating hours.

Now, there were changes made on the GFWC-SC level as well during 2004-2006:

Club President's Institute was held at our Summer Board Meeting instead of a District Conferences as in the past. This was done for two reasons (1) to provide Club Presidents with the information they needed early to help them get their clubs off to a great start and (2) to allow District Presidents more flexibility in scheduling the date and starting times of their District Conferences.

Our Program Council Meeting was also changed so that in the odd numbered year (2005), Program Council convened immediately prior to the Executive Board Meeting at Convention instead of at Summer Board. This change was made out of consideration for those members serving on Program Council who have to travel to Columbia from different parts of our state. It was an effort to save them both time and money.

I have experienced many, many, many more moments as your State President that were magnificent, astonishing, amazing, fantastic and superb.

To celebrate, at our 107th Footprints on the Sands of Time GFWC-SC Convention, the many, many marks made by our GFWC-SC members and clubs in their communities – Astonishing.

To represent you at the GFWC International Convention in Las Vegas and to be able to accept all the awards presented to GFWC-SC for the work done and reported by you in 2004. I went down so many times, that Ernie Shriner, GFWC International President, remarked that if I kept it up I was going to lose a dress size in one day. As reported at our Summer Board Meeting – GFWC-SC was recognized for distinguished service in the following program areas:

Certificates of Recognition were presented to GFWC-SC in the Conservation Department – "Beautification Program" – Meredith Fields, Chairman; in the Home Life Department – "New Horizons in Health" – Misty Konow, Chairman; in the Public Affairs Department – "Community Citizenship Program" – Elizabeth Herring, Chairman, and in the Public Affairs Department – "Community Safety Program" – Gail Elfert, Chairman. There were several individual club recognitions made as well - Fantastic. I look forward to representing you at the 115th GFWC International Convention in Denver – I plan to wear my running shoes.

To attend the 28th consecutive year Cayce Tree Lighting Ceremony hosted by the Woman's Club of Cayce. The program consisted of an inspirational message by a local minister, music by choirs from local schools, greeting from local dignitaries, and the arrival of Santa. Hot Chocolate and cookies were served. There was a great turnout of the community. The Woman's Club of Cayce used this opportunity to collect non-perishable food items for God's Helping Hands.

To have Jackie Pierce, our International President-elect visit us at our January Winter Board Meeting.

In the spring of 2005 to attend the Woman's Study Club of Ridge Spring's 100th Anniversary Celebration, where the celebration event was chaired by Mrs. Truluck, who is 96 years old, and who has been a member over 50 years, and then last week on April 11, 2006, to stand proudly, along with Kathy Monahon, GFWC-SC President-elect and Suzette Porth, Midlands District President, with the members of the Woman's Club of West Columbia, as they were recognized by the SC Senate with a resolution in recognition of 100 years of community service – all of these inspiring.

Our mission during 2004-2006 Administration has been to inform, involve, and to make a difference as a State Federation. We recognized first time attendees, spotlighted GFWC Department Programs, held Leadership-Membership Workshops, collected cell phones for Phones for Soldiers and Call to Protect, initiated letter writing campaign to families of soldiers, offered Heart Healthy Checkups for members, presented an ovarian cancer awareness program, made donations to American Heart Association and American Cancer Society, collected over 200 pounds of food for a soup kitchen, donated to UNICEF for Tsunami Relief, co-produced a television PSA on Child Abuse Awareness, and we are building an ark for Heifer International. Today has been declared our GFWC-SC Service Day and three Children's Shelters, as well as a Women's Shelter, will receive our support and tonight at our "Red Hot Hearts for the Arts" Banquet, we will have our first ever "District Challenge Spirit Contest".

I would like to thank our President, Lynn Cleckler, her energy and enthusiasm is inspiring. She has given so much to our federation and the Children's Trust of Fund of South Carolina through her project "Mending Broken Hearts – Breaking the Cycle of Family Abuse." We thank you for your dedication and leadership. I want to thank the Midlands and Northern Districts for our special Heart & Soul – Hearts of Gold Banquet and the members of the Western District for the lovely Celebration Reception held before this banquet.

I want to especially thank my husband, Tom, for his love and support. With Tom tonight are other members of our family our son, Dan, my mother, Cherieann Herndon, and Tom's brother Joseph and his wife, Ivy. Thank you all for coming and sharing this evening.

It is hard to believe that an invitation by Joan Marine, in 1989, to join Aiken Woman's Club would lead to this night. I was convinced then that Joan only invited me to join because Tom had a truck that could be used for the Very Special Arts Festival. Which it has been for many years! However, her love and encouragement guided me every step of the way toward this night. She instilled a love of GFWC in me and many others. She will be greatly missed.

I would like to thank the members of Aiken Woman's Club for allowing me to volunteer through their projects and by holding offices in the club, which prepared me for my service to GFWC-SC's state offices. Thank you for your support and best wishes.

I still remember the first Western District meeting I attended where I was elected to the state nominating committee. It was a short journey from there to Arts Department Coordinator, Chairman of Progress Foundation and then to State Treasurer. I have been honored by being allowed to serve in each of the state offices. Thank you.

The GFWC-SC 2006-2008 President's Special Project is Habitat for Humanity, which is a program in the Home Life Department. I thank Suzette Porth for agreeing to serve as the chairman of this special project. Detailed information on the GFWC-SC President's Special Project will be distributed at our Summer Board meeting in July.

Recently, in the most thorough study ever undertaken of the causes of crime and delinquency, it was determined that neighborhoods with values have less violent crime. As Stephen L. Covey pointed out in his book on fragmented families and society, "The family is the backbone of our society. If we fragment the family, it is like straightening out deck chairs on the Titanic."

Habitat for Humanity seeks to eliminate poverty housing and to make decent, affordable housing a matter of conscience and action. By having people from all walks of life work together in equal partnership, Habitat builds new relationships and a sense of community as well as homes for low-income families.

Habitat for Humanity International has over 1,700 affiliates in the United States, 38 in South Carolina and operates in 100 other countries. In its 28 years, HFHI has built approximately 200,000 homes for over 900,000 people. Habitat accepts no government funding for home construction, depending on donated volunteer and financial support.

Through volunteer labor, management expertise, and tax-deductible donations of money and materials, Habitat builds homes with the help of the homeowners. Habitat homes are simple, affordable homes constructed with volunteer labor, and are

sold to qualified low-income families at cost, currently \$65,000, and with a 20-year, zero interest mortgage. Each selected family puts 400 hours of "sweat equity", helping to build their home or another Habitat project. Small monthly mortgage payments, including taxes and insurance, are repaid over 20 years and deposited into a revolving "Fund for Humanity", which supports the construction of more houses. Habitat for Humanity offers a hand up, instead of a handout to these families.

Why choose Habitat? Charitable foundations, civic organizations, businesses and corporations, churches and individual donors like Habitat because:

- Purely and simply, it works! Habitat has proven itself in communities throughout the country. It's practical and straightforward.
- Business people like the idea of no government taxes being involved, nor any bureaucratic strings being attached.
- Habitat offers a long-term solution to a real problem, not "here today and gone tomorrow". With widespread community support, it is enduring and self-perpetuating.
- Habitat is not a band-aid approach. It acts as a healing agent within the community and strengthens on the basis of people helping people. It is a partnership among all peoples.
- Habitat's houses are designed for the motivated poor. Those who lack interest or motivation are not viable applicants. Habitat promotes responsible citizenship and pride in the community.
- Habitat attempts to build quality housing, while keeping designs simple and efficient.
- Habitat's work is both tangible and highly visible.
 Contributors can literally watch their donations
 being put to work can actually volunteer and
 work on the houses themselves. In replacing
 poverty housing with decent homes, Habitat
 projects come to be appreciated as assets by all
 members of the community.

Shelter is a basic human need, and the future has already been changed for many in South Carolina by Habitat's efforts meeting the need. I hope you will embrace the GFWC-SC 2006-2008 President's Special Project by supporting Habitat for Humanity.

In the words of Gillian Anderson - "Be of service. Whether you make yourself available to a friend or co-worker, or you make time every month to do volunteer work, there is nothing that harvests more of a feeling of empowerment than being of service to someone in need."

Until she unfolded her hand,



Just inside the Garden gate, visitors enjoy an impressive welcome from the enchanting Bog Garden. A leisurely walk over the Treetops Bridge leads to the tranquil Shade Garden.

Garden guests welcome the exquisite blooms and refreshing aromas of the Old Rose Garden. Discover the charm of the 34,000-square-foot Walled Garden, Riverbanks' premier botanical exhibit. This magnificent maze of seasonal and themed gardens inspires new ideas and awakens the imagination, often influencing the design of local backyards.
